Yash from Face to Face classes

Yash has grown significantly in his expressive communication in recent months and his funny, social side is blossoming. Since starting to use eye gaze, Yash is initiating conversation, requesting all sorts of items and activities and making his classmates laugh and smile. He is visibly proud of his new skills and enjoys the positive social feedback from his peers, something that was previously very challenging for him. His increased communication ability is assisting him to self regulate more effectively and he is starting to understand that he can have his needs met when he asks. Well done Yash, we are so proud of you.





Tiella from Distance Education Unit. We presented Tiella via online media in the school's special "green screen communications room" with her proud mother there to support her.

Tiella is a dedicated, enthusiastic student. She participates in online lessons each week, greeting her peers and teachers with a smile. Tiella regularly attends cooking, online reading and social club. She patiently waits her turn, listens attentively and excitedly vocalises to share her understanding. Congratulations Tiella.

Together with the teachers we have supported Terrific Kids at Sir Eric Woodward School since 2014.

Terrific Kids are those who have been:-Thoughtful, Enthusiastic, Respectful, Responsible, Inclusive, Friendly, Inquisitive or Capable.

Kiwanis Sydney is particularly proud of Yash who we have seen develop so much over the 11 years we have been making TK awards at SEWS. We were first introduced to SEWS when Yash's mother, Namita, spoke at a Kiwanis Sydney meeting about Pallister Killian syndrome. Yash has been awarded TK five times over the years.

SEWS teachers and support staff are to be commended on their work with children like Yash. We got to see that even though children are non-verbal, the children can now use eye gaze to select from approximately 9 choices on an iPad screen. A row of cameras below the iPad interprets what choice the person has made on the screen, vocalises their choice and may go on to enact the choice. We saw Yash's choice of "Twelve Days of Christmas" played for him to enjoy. We were also wished "See you later alligator" by one other girl in the class as we wished her goodbye. Screens can be set to music choices, food choices, greetings and even ask about any pains the child maybe suffering. What a fantastic use of technology!

Beanies for Elderly

At our Mother's Day flowers and cards presentation at Caroline Chisholm Nursing Home, they raised that several of the people suffered from cold heads and would benefit from beanies.

Cathy got out her trusty needles to start knitting. In talking to a friend at golf, she was also given 40 promotional beanies. To date we have 50 beanies.

Emily has taken 20 of these to Caroline Chisholm Nursing Home for distribution to those elderly who need them.

Rona is working at Bolton Clarke Pemulwuy Aged Care Home and lives in Greystanes.

Following are some abridged comments by Rona.

I am fortunate to have the support of my husband, Alfred Anthony Bongolto, accompanying me during my temporary study period in Australia. His unwavering mental, physical, and emotional support will undoubtedly be invaluable. Alfred and I are blessed with 4 children, namely Carissa Alyanna, Aldrich, Cheska Eunize and Ezekiel who have remained in the Philippines.

The health industry has always been my passion and in the Philippines, I was employed at HELP RESCUE 411 as an Ambulance Nurse/ EMT- Emergency Medical Technician and Critical Care Transport Nurse. This job has exposed me to ongoing learning and development in meeting the medical needs and rapport that is needed



in certain situations. An ability to communicate to multiple types of individuals is an essential part of our job and I wanted to improve this part of me by taking formal studies that concentrate on the technical side of the community work. Especially those individuals situated in some rural areas who are more sceptical to try new health approaches.

In Australia I have completed a Certificate III in Individual Support in 2023, and a Certificate IV in Ageing in 2024. Both courses were undertaken at Linx Institute College, Sydney Campus Australia.

I am practicing my new skills in the aged Care Industry, currently working in Bolton Clarke-Pemulwuy as a casual. I am also expanding my skills with another company in handling Disability Support.

I have decided to pursue a Diploma of Community Services which covers a wide range of topics, including communication skills, cultural competence, counselling techniques, and social policy. This diversity can make my learning experience rich and varied.

In this field workers support people to make change in their lives to improve personal and social wellbeing. I may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers.

While in Australia I wanted to Make a Difference. Being part of an organization dedicated to helping children can be a fulfilling way to contribute to positive change and make a real impact on young lives. I researched different organisations and thankfully I found the KIWANIS SYDNEY.

My mother (Imelda Waga) is an active member of Kiwanis in Division 4 of the Philippines. She introduced me to KIWANIS. Because of that, I am now a member of KIWANIS SYDNEY. I am grateful to all the members and the core group who are supportive and kind to me in this journey. (*Object #5 in practice*)

Joining this organization that focuses on helping children is incredibly rewarding. You get to be part of initiatives that directly influence young lives, whether through education, mentorship, advocacy, or providing essential resources. It's a way to channel your passion and skills into something meaningful, and the impact you make can resonate for years to come. Kiwanis Sydney donated to KCF (Kiwanis Children's Fund) in honour of Beryl Spechler. As recognition of the donation KCF awarded a George F Hixson – Diamond Level Award in Beryl's name.

Kiwanis International Convention

The Kiwanis International Convention was held in Denyer, USA in early July with approximately 1,500 members in attendance.

Australian Governor Elect David McNabb and Lieutenant Governor Elect Division 1 Joseph Fombason represented Kiwanis Australia.

There was a tribute to recently passed Ian Perdriau AM who was the first person outside North America to serve as Kiwanis International President in 1994-95. Kiwanis thanked him for his service, and in particular the IDD Project (Iodine Deficiency Disorder).

Some amendments were voted on by the House of Delegates with the most notable being to increase KI Dues from US\$52 to US\$77. Combined with careful budget practices and ongoing cost reductions, the increase will help reduce future deficits and ensure the organisation's long-term financial health.

"The Possibility Project" worldwide project was announced. It aims to raise US\$25m over 5 years to help 10 million kids through KCF. It will address areas of – Health and Nutrition in young: Education & Literacy in school age kids; Youth Leadership Development in older children.

Elected leaders for 2024-25 are KI President – Lee Kuan Yong from Kiwanis Club of Kuala Lumpur – Malaysia, KI President Elect Michael Mulhaul from New Jersey USA and KI Vice President Hope Markes from Hanover Jamaica. Lee Kuan Yong's aim is to build 420 new clubs.

Some other interesting learnings were the average age of Kiwanians is now 61 yo. Fundraisers being used by clubs include 1. Lego Building and 2. Grand Wine Tasting

KI 2025 Convention will be held in Pittsburgh 25th to 28th June 2025 with the theme "Forge the Future"

Bunnings BBQ & Pot
