At our August meeting we had Justine as the guest speaker about her upcoming bicycle ride in Thailand for Hands Across the Water. Extracts have been taken from the HAtW webiste

Hands started in 2005 after the Boxing Day Tsunami of December 2004 decimated parts of Thailand along with other countries in the area. Peter Baines and Gill Williams were working on the recovery efforts and teamed with a local to start the charity.



Hands started out supporting 34 children in the small community of Khao Lak and due to the increased demand of our services and through the generosity

of our community and valued partners has expanded its reach to care for 350 children across 7 projects in Thailand. Hands has gone from employing one staff member to providing employment to over 60 people across Thailand.

The children come from:- no known family to support them; have a family member but unable to support them; and those living in an unsafe environment.



Hands provides food, money and outreach to set the children up for life. Kids are encouraged to garden at the homes so they learn self sufficiency.

In January 2025 to celebrate the 20th anniversary of formation, Justine and fifty other cyclists will ride 800 kilometres in 8 days to raise funds to support this worthwhile cause. On one rest day they visit one of the

homes and their ride takes them through some of the key tsunami sites. Each rider has a fundraising target of \$10.000 in addition to their costs.

Kiwanis Sydney appreciated hearing about this worthwhile cause and the Board subsequently voted to support Justine. Thank-you Justine and to Vicki for organising this talk.

City to Surf

For the third year Kiwanis Sydney volunteered to man the drink station at Rose Bay for a fun day and to raise some funds for the club.

This year there were 85,000 participants in the City to Surf with the first wave coming through Rose Bay at 7.45am and the last of the walkers coming through at 11am. The sheer bulk of people means that placing of cups, filling them with water and handing some to runners is fast and furious.

Kiwanis Sydney had 19 volunteers in their team and had fun interacting with the other teams and the runners. It is also great to see the outfits that runners wear. This varied from the minimum of a pair of budgie smugglers up to full gorilla suits and the like. A group of firefighters did the run in full uniform, complete with breathing apparatus.

Thanks to Sree for her organisation of the day and to all the volunteers who made the early start.

From Steve's nomination speech:-

I did have a short time out of Kiwanis while living in Wollongong. I have lived Object 5 in forming enduring friendships through all these clubs and through attending Mini Conventions, District Conventions, ASPAC Conventions and KI Conventions.

At club levels I have served as President, Secretary, Treasurer and Newsletter Editor.

At District level I have served as Lieutenant Governor Division 1 for 2 years, District Secretary for 4 years, Eliminate Coordinator for 11 years and as a Board Member of KADCF for the last 5 years.

I believe my experience on the Kiwanis Australia Board for 6 years stands me in good stead for the position of Governor-Elect.

We have clubs doing fantastic work for the community in their local areas, Australia and internationally. Our numbers of members and clubs have reduced to a critical point where we could see all this great work come to an end. We need to arrest the decline so that our good work continues.

I will work with David to develop and start a plan for the future of Kiwanis Australia. I have Cathy's support for the role and Kiwanis Sydney is also backing me in.

Steve embarks on 3 years in the leadership team as Governor-Elect, Governor and then Immediate Past Governor.


