

A bit of advice.....





Wendy Percy will present awards at Henley Beach School in August and Shane Misso will present awards on our behalf at Glenelg Primary School in August, as we do not have anyone who is able to do so from our club, with Convention at that time.

If you would like to visit schools to present Terrific Kids awards at any time, please let us know. We are always needing someone to do so and it is a very rewarding and happy thing to do that does not take up much time. Thank you.







Note from the Board—it has been decided that at <u>Bunnings barbecues</u> and <u>events</u>, we will put up a notice about which organisation we are supporting at that event — ie Childhood Cancer, Treasure Boxes, HeartKids, Operation Flinders, a Frame Runner etc.

These events have been successful with extra donations being given.

Christine Teagle and our 2 secretaries designed the flyers which we are using. The flyers are A4 size and laminated (by Christine Teagle).

Look out for the one we use on any given day and if anyone asks who we are <u>supporting</u>, please give them the name of the organisation. (use the word "supporting") - see flyer at right as an example.



As has been advised at dinner meetings, our club has a healthy bank balance.

However just to let you know that we have made some donations recently and have some yet to come. As you know, we are donating \$6,000 to Operation Flinders. Our recent function didn't make that much profit so we will be dipping into our account a bit.

We've just donated \$1,000 to Ronald McDonald House.

We have also recently made donations to Treasure Boxes and Backpacks 4 SAKids and have also just approved a donation of \$1,200 to Riding for the Disabled SA which will go to providing hay for the horses. Our speaker on 11th August will tell us more about how they will use this donation and what it is like at the moment looking after these beautiful animals so that they can continue to provide their service to disabled children and adults.

We also come to that time of the year where we need to collect annual fees to go to Kiwanis International, Insurance and Kiwanis Australia District and we fairy heavily subsidise these fees, so need to keep some aside for that. And we do keep a large amount aside for self-insurance of items in our shed, and another amount that we are holding to donate for another frame runner when the time is right. We also have our regular donations like funding the Brighton PS breakfast program per term, the Possibility Project, the donations we make to the Kiwanis Australia District programs—HeartKids, Children First Foundation and the Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia Research Foundation at SAHMRI. And all the other donations we make to different groups throughout the year...

.....and more which will possibly include a Division 8 combined project with other clubs. All very happily donated so we can continue our work to help children whenever and wherever we can.

You would have read recently that we have doubled our donation to St Judes Church for the **Brighton Primary School breakfast program**—we will now donate \$500 per term towards this.

They have agreed to hang our big banner for 2 (separate) months of the year outside the church on Brighton Road, Brighton right at the intersection with Jetty Road, Brighton, where it will be seen by thousands in cars, walking or on bikes etc.

The banner went up a while ago thanks to Alan, Bob and Peter1—have you seen it yet?

Thanks to Peter Symons for arranging all this with the Church people. nd also to Bob Sitters for the behind the scenes organisation with Sign Style. The banner looks like this



Owen has purchased 6 x Oztrail weights for our marquees at \$35 each —bought with Bunnings vouchers that we have been given from assisting Bunnings with events like the Mothers' Day barbecues etc. These are heavy weights for holding down the marquees when windy.

We have continued our membership with Coast FM—\$120 per year and we have from time to time had them read out our advertisement for our club or heard our club "sting" and also they were advertising our Musical Bingo event for us. As most of you would know, our club members Dave Cook and Pam Smith are actually presenters on Coast FM.

We have been asked to participate in the City to Bay Fun Run again this year after not doing so the previous year. However, after discussion at the Board Meeting earlier this month, it has been decided that we will not help out again this year. It is an incredibly early start and we have been asked to pour water at the Morphettville station which is not our preferred option. We aso thought the remuneration was not as good as we would have liked.

The Holdfast Bay Council does an annual assessment at our shed, situated at Glenelg North. Owen and Peter Symons made sure everything was as it should be and we did get praised for that, however they advised that we should be using a Food Grade Sanitiser—we should wash utensils with water and detergent after use, dry and then spray on the Food Grade Sanitiser. Peter Symons has purchased this now and advised the Council, as requested.

We have been asked and have agreed to once again cook a breakfast barbecue at Barratt Reserve for the participants and others of the Bay to Birdwood Car Rally. This is to be held on Sunday 19th October. We will be asking many club members and even some of their friends to volunteer for this event. It is always a great team effort and financially worth it for us to do so. Please keep the date free and Marilyn will send a roster around at the appropriate time.

We've also accepted an invitation to cook a barbecue at the Seacliff Recreation Centre Open Day which will be on Sunday 26 October. We won't need too many volunteers for this one. Again, Marilyn will send a roster around at a club meeting.

Did you know our Board meets once a month at Club Marion? The meeting is chaired by President Trevor Averay and an Agenda is prepared and followed. Minutes of these meetings are typed up and sent to all Board members after the meeting. Each Board member has his or her Actions to follow after the meetings.


Another admin task is the sending of a Monthly Report to Kiwanis International and we also do Quarterly Reports which are for Kiwanis Australia District.


