**Governor's Newsletter February 2026**

Remember my Motto for this year is *#Kids need Kiwanis, Kiwanis needs You!*

**Club Officer Elections** – Your club elections are coming up in April/May. One of my goals is for every club to elect at least one new person to the club executive of President, President Elect, Secretary or Treasurer. In this way we facilitate personal development in our members and provide "value". To achieve this goal your nomination officer needs to be approaching candidates personally and asking them if they would be willing to stand. Of course you need to assure them they will have the support of more experienced members.

**Kiwanis Australia Leadership** We are looking for a Governor-Elect, Lieutenant Governors for some of the Divisions and an Australian Kiwanian (AK) Editor. If you want to know more about any of these positions then please contact myself or Peter Zander.

**Kiwanis Australia Board Meeting** – the second meeting of the Board was held by Zoom last Saturday morning. Besides hearing reports and various approvals a revision to our Child Protection Policy was considered. Since our original policy was written in 2004 there have been many changes in Australian laws and regulations. We will be seeking feedback from the clubs before we implement. I thank Chair Laws and Policies Tim Looker for leading these changes.

**Victorian Bush Fire Appeal** – I am pleased this appeal to clubs has so far raised more than \$18,000 to support children in the fire affected areas. Thanks to LG Division 7, Tim Dawes and the clubs of Division 7 for taking the lead in identifying the best use of our funds. They are talking to principals of various schools in these areas about the needs. Kiwanis Bendigo have held barbeques for the community to provide emotional support, socialising and intend to support children's school camps, tennis lessons and various other ways where the affected families are suffering hardship. Thank you to all clubs for your support.

**Signature Projects** – Glenelg, Warrambool, Geelong, Newcastle and Barossa submitted entries to the KI Signature Projects Competition. KI received a record 592 entries from 45 Districts. Kiwanis Australia had the unenviable task of selecting one entry from our clubs 27 and less, and one from the larger clubs. Kiwanis Australia has selected the Kiwanis Newcastle Charity Christmas Trees and the Kiwanis Barossa Emergency Frozen Meals projects to represent us. We will watch to see how our club projects compare to others around the world. Thank you to the clubs who entered. Remember, having a Signature Project is the first step your club can take to being better known in the community. Your members will find it easier to talk about *What does Kiwanis Do?*

**Kiwanis Australia District Convention** will be held at Rydges Sydney Central Hotel on Fri 21<sup>st</sup> to Sun 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2026. The registration form and other details will be sent to all members in the next couple of weeks. Come by train, plane or car and do some sightseeing of Sydney while there. We'd love to see all clubs represented. We are also looking for a club or division to run the 2027 District Convention.

**Growth** Kiwanis Australia has added 26 new members this year and had 10 deletes to take our total to 570. Make sure you invite someone to talk about Kiwanis over coffee or bring them to a meeting or project. Remember to ask them if they would like to join! *Kids need Kiwanis!*

**Amplify** Kiwanis Amplify is a professional leadership program for those who want to amplify their ability to lead in all aspects of their lives. 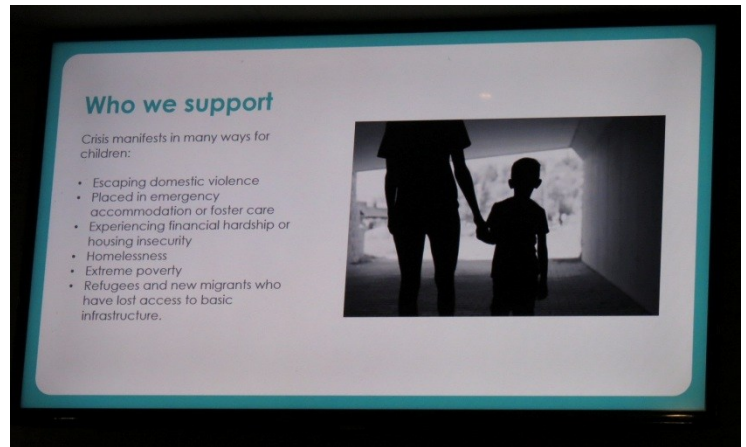

**SCASA LUNCH—this is a report from Peter Zander, District Governor-Elect and Kiwanis Glenelg member**

**SCASA Awards Luncheon Report Sunday 22nd Feb 2026**

The luncheon for the SCASA (Service Clubs Association of South Australia) Premier’s Community Service Awards was held on the 22nd of February at Auchendarroch House, Mount Barker.

As the Kiwanis representative on the SCASA Committee, Yvonne and I attended the luncheon on behalf of Kiwanis, as unfortunately the date clashing with the Kiwanis Training Day there were no other Kiwanis representatives.

The SCASA Awards are held annually, where clubs from Rotary, Lions, Kiwanis, Soroptimist and Zonta receive awards for their community service projects for the previous 12 months, based on their nominations that are independently judged.

There are 9 categories that clubs can nominate for (Community Activity, Community Education, Community Environment, Community Event, Community Sustainability, Health, Social Inclusion, Team, Youth Awards), as well as 3 specific other Awards (Harry Tillyer School Award, Allan Sloan Young Citizen Award and the Heidi Taylor Community Service Award). I represent Kiwanis on the Committee as well as being the Treasurer and Nominations Coordinator.

The awards are supported financially by the State Premier with funds of \$16,000 being shared for category winners and runner ups and again this year an amount of \$250 allocated to each nominating Club. This is what the Glenelg Club received this year, although previous Kiwanis Clubs including Glenelg have been category finalists. The Glenelg nomination for last year was in the Community Activity Award for the Breakfast Program at Brighton Primary School.

As well as the previous mentioned categories, the Premier’s Distinction Award is given to the best overall project selected from the category winning entries.

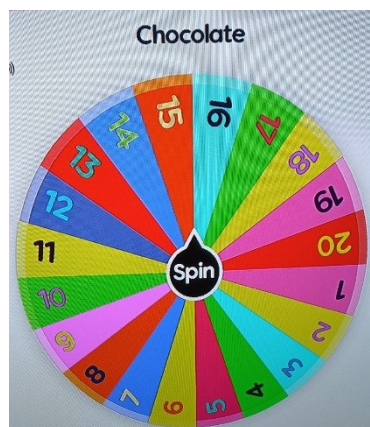

Some donations and unused product accounted for some of the difference.

Those of you at our last meeting saw the big bottle of wine that we have had donated. The story goes:

Val is admin for the Kiwanis District facebook page.

A message came through from Linda, a Kiwanis member in Canada. Linda said she had won a big bottle (3 ltrs) of top class wine from Kies Winery which is in our Barossa Valley, but it's a bit of a stretch for her to visit from Canada to take it back home. She asked if anyone from Kiwanis in SA would go and collect the wine and think of a way that it could be put to good use to raise funds for children here in Australia.

After liaising with District and then asking club members at Glenelg how we could best use this wonderful donation to raise funds for children, not just going into Glenelg club's fund-raising account, an idea came up later. Val Symons noticed that the Childhood Cancer Association was holding a big event in August at the Adelaide Convention Centre. It is called the Gold Ribbon Gala. Peter wondered if they would like this wine to put up for auction and any funds they receive they can use for their own projects. Having then contacted Cath O'Loughlin, who was our guest in February of this year, Cath was very happy about this and readily said yes.

The 3 ltr bottle is valued at \$600. The wine was made by the Kies Winery winemaker, Bronson, and it was named Guardian Angel, in honour of Bronson's grandfather, the wine maker before him, who was always taking Bronson to the vineyard to explain how it is grown and how wine is made. Unfortunately Bronson's grandfather passed away and Bronson made this wine in honour of him. As mentioned it is called Guardian Angel, which we feel also fits perfectly with the Childhood Cancer Association.

There is a photo here of Peter Symons with this huge bottle of very good wine. The bottle is very shiny and looks beautiful. It will be placed into the silent auction as our donation to this event and mention made that it was donated by Kiwanis.

Any profits will go directly to the Childhood Cancer Association.

Linda Jarvis from the Kiwanis Club of Saint John New Brunswick, Canada and our District contact Tony Gunn know about this arrangement.

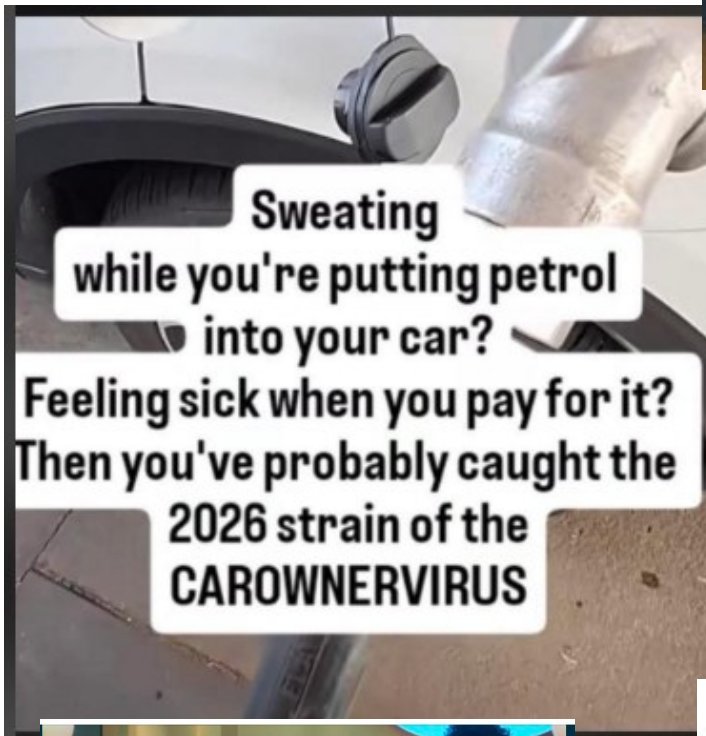

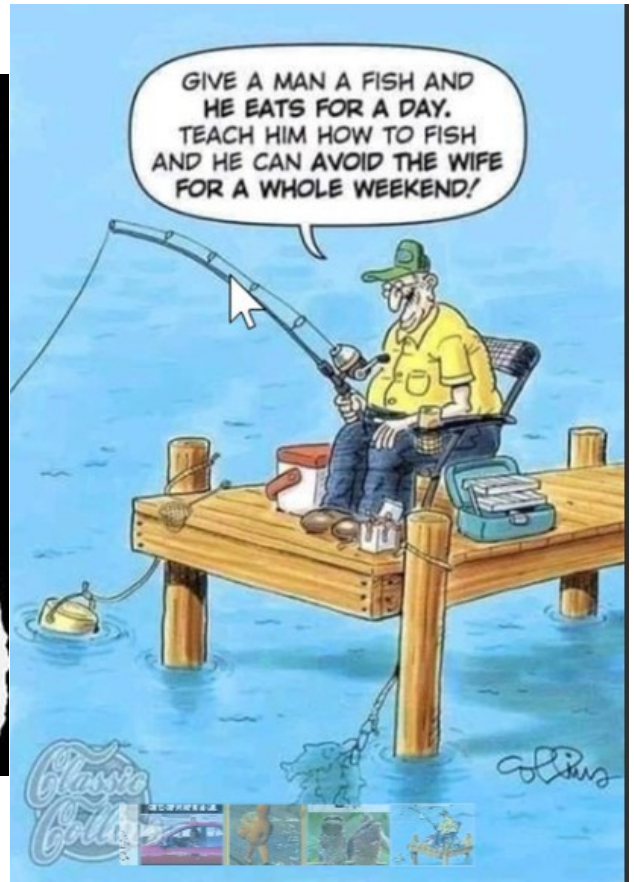
