

Kiwanis Trivia

The first Kiwanis International convention staged outside the United States and Canada was in Vienna, Austria, in 1983. The event commemorated the 20th anniversary of the organization of the Vienna club, which was the first in Europe. The second international convention outside North America occurred in Nice, France, in 1993. Taipei, Taiwan, hosted the 2001 convention, the first in Asia. In 2010, the Kiwanis International Board adopted the policy of hosting the international convention outside North America every three years, alternating between Europe and Asia Pacific.
