It was first called “The Kiwanis Club.” Two other titles, “The Hornet” and “The Torch,” were tried in 1918–20, but quickly abandoned for the simple descriptive title “The Kiwanis Magazine.” In 1976, this was further abbreviated to “Kiwanis magazine.”
