The first Kiwanis motto, "We Build," was adopted in 1920. It was proposed by Roe Fulkerson, first editor of Kiwanis Magazine. "God inspired me to write those two words—We Build," Fulkerson said. "I am prouder of them than any other accomplishment in my life." That accomplishment served as the Kiwanis motto for 85 years. A bronze bust of Mr. Fulkerson is on display at the international office in Indianapolis.
