Bing Goei was born in Jakarta, Indonesia. His family left the country in 1954 and spent some time in the Netherlands before arriving in Grand Rapids in 1960. He worked his way up to owning <u>Eastern Floral</u> and was asked by Gov. Snyder to serve as Director for the Office for New Americans. He illustrates the perfect image of an immigrant who fulfills the American Dream.

Dr. James Fahner provided the club with an update from the <u>Helen DeVos Children's Hospital</u> and the We Do Care fund, which was founded by our own Frank Archer in 1986. Dr. Fahner provided the members with details on how the hospital used the money from the fund to help families at the hospital. Many times families are on their "last leg" when their child is in the hospital with mounting bills and stress. The fund helps these families with things like gas money, groceries, bus passes, hotels, and even childcare. He also spoke about the many successes the hospital has



in fighting childhood cancer. The hospital received a \$200,000 grant from Hyundai "Hope On Wheels" to fight pediatric cancers. For the 10th consecutive year the hospital is listed by US News and World Report as one of the top 50 hospitals for childhood cancer.
