The first president of Kiwanis International elected from outside the United States was the third, Henry J. Elliott of Montreal, Quebec, who served in 1919–20. The first president elected from outside the two founding nations was Ian Perdriau AM, a member of the Kiwanis Club of Melbourne, Australia, who served in 1994–95. Eyjólfur "Eddie" Sigurðsson, a member of the Kiwanis Club of Reykjavik-Hekla, Iceland, served in 1995–96 as the first president elected from the European Federation.
