Jenny Steele with Hand2Hand spoke about how churches partner with schools to provide weekend meals for kids. They have 145 West Michigan churches that work with 280 schools. Over 15,000 kids benefit from the weekend meals. When the children arrive to school on Friday the weekend meals are already in their lockers. For the older kids, they have other ways to hand out



the food while still maintaining dignity and privacy for the student.
