

Kiwanis Trivia

The first president of Kiwanis International was George F. Hixson of the Rochester, New York, Kiwanis Club. He was elected in 1916 at the first international convention in Cleveland and re-elected the next year. The Hixson Fellowship of the Kiwanis International Foundation is named in his honor; Hixson awards are presented to donors who have contributed at least US\$1,000 Kiwanis Children's Fund.

Every year the club helps local children have a Merry Christmas with gifts under the tree. **Kids at Christmas** is the Signature Project where all members get excited and participate. Working with four of our "Terrific Kids" schools, the faculty nominate students that may not have any, or very few, presents to open on Christmas morning. We take the parent on a secret shopping trip without the children having any knowledge of our participation. By remaining a silent partner the children think the presents came from "Santa" or their parents.

This year our club helped **35 families** with a total of **99 children**.
