Kiwanis Trivia

Until 1962, Kiwanis clubs were limited to the United States and Canada. But club delegates to the 1961 convention in Toronto approved the extension of Kiwanis to the rest of the world. In April 1962, the Kiwanis Club of Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, became the first club to be organized outside the two founding nations.

Kids at Christmas

Every year the club helps local children have a Merry Christmas with gifts under the tree. **Kids at Christmas** is the Signature Project where all members get excited and participate. Working with four of our “Terrific Kids” schools, the faculty nominate students that may not have any, or very few, presents to open on Christmas morning. We take the parent on a secret shopping trip without the children having any knowledge of our participation. By remaining a silent partner the children think the presents came from “Santa” or their parents.

This year our club helped **40 families** with a total of **110 children**.

Kiwanis International has been serving the children of the world for over a century — and in that time, it has permeated popular culture as well.
