They work with parents and collaborate with 39 programs and organizations to make sure that children receive everything they need to start kindergarten by the age of 5.

Carolyn Geck with [Covenant House](#) talked about the organization which provides safe housing and care to youth ages 16-21 experiencing homelessness and survivors of human trafficking. They operate in 13 states and 5 countries and provide stability and resources to help these individuals get on their feet.



Gregg Hampshire with the [Creston Neighborhood Association](#) spoke about the latest developments on the north side of Grand Rapids. They strive for a diverse community where all neighbors thrive. They hope that people can not only live in the area but also work and play.
