Emily Hawkins is the lead coach for The St Louis Performance Academy. The original founder was Emily's mother, Kelly Wicks, and the name was Kelly's Cuties. The academy teaches baton twirling. The classes range from beginner level through elite. Ages range from 5 through 22. Baton twirling is a unique sport and is offered at many public and private school districts. In addition to Emily being the Lead Coach, she also teaches dance classes at the schools. The baton twirling includes dance steps. The two sports seem to go hand in hand. Conditioning is a requirement of training, and the students are required to run three miles a week outside of class. The academy currently has 200 students. In addition to competitions, they perform all across Missouri, at parades, charity events, tree lightings, Silver Dollar City, nursing homes and so on. In August of this year, Emily and 33 baton twirlers will be traveling to Liverpool England for the International World Twirling Competition. All twirlers from Mehlville and Oakville schools will be traveling to England. The academy is the only one from the United States to perform in their category. Quite an accomplishment! Emily's motto is to Engage, Motivate and Inspire. At the end of Emily's presentation, Nora and Jordan performed for our members in the parking lot of Fraley's. It was amazing! Thank you, Nora and Jordan.
