A lifelong entrepreneur, philanthropist, civic leader and most recently Mayor of Brant County, Mayor Bailey started his presentation titled "The County of Brant Land Development", using a slide presentation.

With Mayor Bailey's enthusiasm and straight-talk, the slides were used as a guide line, but the real meaning and effects were what he was telling us orally. He verified that the increase population coming to Brant was inevitable. We have to increase our tax base to supply the new services

that the members in the community needs and demands.

He also understands that, rather than just removing land marks and facilities to build tall apartment buildings and stretches of new homes, that all people involved in these changes must be aware of the emotional and social inpact that these changes are having on current residents. The citizens who have lived their entire life in a specific area of Brant, and are familiar with the land and facilities in these areas, are now reaching an age that they have to move into some type of assisted living. To enable this, our government is uprooting these individuals and moving them to facilities in Brantford, Burlington or Hamilton.

Mayor Bailey indicated that things are going to continue to grow and change, and many changes are for the good. He also indicated that we have to be aware that some of the seemingly small

items that are being erased without a thought, are the foundation components that make Brant County home to its residents.

Our members were keen listeners and really appreciated Mayor Bailey's frank and entertaining presentation.

Kiwanian Leo Vos formally thanked Mayor David Bailey.
