
Highlights of the Thursday, 29 June, 2023 Weekly Meeting

President Dave called the Weekly meeting to Order at 12:30 p.m. and welcomed fellow Kiwanians and Guests. We had one Guest, Richard Kleri from the North Dumfries Kiwanis Club, who asked to speak to our Club later in the meeting.

Following the Opening Thought for the Day, President Dave asked Kiwanian Phil to conduct the 50/50 draw. The Draw today is at more that \$700 with 21 cards left in the deck. LG Nelson and Bob Wade were the 1st and 2nd place ticket holders but lady-luck did not shine on either Kiwanian.

President Dave thanked Funmaster Faye for an interesting, informative and fun presentation, and the wonderful decorations and atmosphere she had created for this meeting.

President Dave asked our Guest Kiwanian Richard Kleri of the North Dumfries Kiwanis Club to come to the podium to address the members. Kiwanian Richard indicated that he is the President of the new North Dumfries Kiwanis Club near Ayr, and that he was here to thank our Club for support in starting his new Club, in particular LG Nelson, PG Joanne, and Kiwanian Randy and that they had just held their 1^{st,} successful Fund Raiser. Richard was warmly welcomed and asked to keep our lines of communication open so we might



learn of new projects where we might be able to borrow from his experience and vice versa.

President Dave gave a brief update about the Kiwanis International Convention 2023 in Minneapolis, Minnesota:

Total Clubs represented - 691; Total Voting Delegates - 972 and Total Delegates -1,336

Amendments:

- 1) Motion to approve of the "Modernization Version of the International Bylaws" as circulated was **APPROVED**
- 2) Motion to increase the Kiwanis International dues by \$30 American was **DEFEATED**

Elections:

Confirmed - Incoming 2023-2024, President Kristine Baranko, Georgia District **Confirmed** - Incoming 2023-2024, President elect Lee Kuan Yong, Malaysia District **Elected** - Incoming 2023-2024, Vice President Michael Mulhall, New Jersey District

President Dave asked Vice President Nancy Thompson to come to the podium to give her impression as a first-time attendee at a Kiwanis International Convention.

She said that it was interesting to see so many people from different countries such as Taiwan, and the enthusiasm they had. She noted that even though they appear very different we all had similar challenges and approached these tasks with the energy and ingenuity, just as we do.

Nancy made note that some of the information sessions were very emotional. She sighted a specific presentation by a US Airman who has spent a great deal of his free time



volunteering his help and knowledge in Ukraine, due to the War, and his passionate plea for everyone to help.

Nancy also said it gave her more time to become familiar with our own Club members in a setting quite different from our normal activities. She said that if anyone could attend these conventions, they would find them very worthwhile.

President Dave thanked VP Nancy for her report.

Dave indicated that he would be speaking about an Educational Session that may be of use in this coming year.

He indicated that the Forum was called: **Service Leadership Programs an Investment in the Future. (SLP)**

We currently have one SLP in our Club which is the Aktion Club. Just a few years ago we also had two Key Clubs. One at BCI and a second at PJ. Various factors lead to the disbanding of the Charter at these schools.

The speakers at this forum indicated that KI has been working on setting up structures that will allow Key Clubs and children of high school age, to be chartered without direct support of a high school.

We have made contact with the **Service Leadership Program** Director in Indianapolis at this forum who, once the 2023 Key Club Convention is over in July 2023, has agree to send us information about the new structure and newly elected contacts, to possibly add a Key Club back into our Clubs **Service Leadership Programs**.

President Dave asked if there were any other announcements or committee reports.

Seeing none, he thanked all the Members and Guest Richard Kleri

He then gave the final thought for the day: "Amateurs built the ark. Professionals built the Titanic."

If there is nothing else for the good of Kiwanis, we will adjourn this meeting with the ringing of the bell. Have a great weekend.
