
Highlights of the Thursday, 09 November, 2023 Weekly Meeting

President Elect Nancy Thompson called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM, welcoming all members and Guests: Hug, Veronica Webb, Christina Dero Senior Executive Assistant GEDSB and Guest Speaker Dr. JoAnna Roberto



Following the opening thought for the day, PE Nancy called on Vice President Maureen to coordinate the 50/50 Draw. VP Maureen indicated that there were 49 Cards in todays' Deck. The two lucky ticket holders

DST Jim moved us on to a film clip titled, "What They Won't Tell You" an acknowledgment the upcoming Rememberance Day. This film was about the men and women who return after the war and their silence relating to their experiences during the war.

DST Jim called up Birthdays and anniversaries which we celebrated and Happy Stories from some members. He then handed the podium back to VP Maureen to introduce our Guest Speaker.

VP Maureen introduced Dr. JoAnna Roberto, Director of Education, GEDSB, Her topic was: the Board's Multi-Year Strategic Plan.



Dr. Roberto began with a brief background about the area covered by the GEDSB and the demographics of the students within its boundaries. In 2020-21 GEDSB had 72 Schools. 58 Elementary Schools, 14 Secondary Schools with a Budget



Grand Erie District School Board represents more than 26,000 students in 58 elementary schools and 14

secondary schools within the City of Brantford and the counties of Brant, Haldimand, and Norfolk as well as secondary students from Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Dr. Roberta said they have a Bold New Vision for Grand Erie, a Vision to Learn, Lead and Inspire ...and a Mission to build a culture of Learning, Well-Being and Belonging.



She indicated that the 2016-20 Multi-Year Plan provided a focused direction for growth and improvement throughout our schools and all levels of our organization. Coming out of one of the most challenging times in the history of education, now is the right time to chart our new path and vision for the future. Setting up students for success must include a bigger focus on access to learning, equity and inclusiveness, and a culture of well-being.

The Grand Erie District School Board had a consultation process where they listened to the voices inside and outside Grand Erie.

They invited students, staff, families and community partners to submit their input on how the board is doing, what could be improved and key priorities for the future. They collected feedback between April and June 2023 through virtual community consultation sessions, ThoughtExchange, surveys and email. Through "ThoughtExchange", we had over 650 participants contribute over 330 ideas and over 7,400 engagements with those ideas.

What we heard were key items such as:

Our Vision

Learn Lead Inspire

Why these three words?

1) They are active. 2) They are optimistic and hopeful 3) They build a culture of leaders.

Our Mission

Together, we build a culture of learning, well-being and belonging to inspire each learner.

Our Collective Priorities

We build a culture with these priorities:

- Learning
 - To nurture curiosity and opportunity for each learner.
- Well-being
 - To support the cognitive, social emotional and physical needs of each learner.
- Belonging
 - To support an equitable, inclusive and responsive environment for each learner



Dr. Roberto closed by answering several questions from our members and distributed GEDSB Carry-Bags to them, which included a hard copy of the "Annual Learning and Operating Plan 2022-23" with a Card image Graphic Plan for 2023-24, plus a GEDSB Pin. She also distributed sample cards and label rolls with Booster Messages for students who did something outstanding.
