currently is the operator of Hope's Closet Boutique on Paris Rd.

Erica explained that, prior to the March 2023 opening of Hope's Closet Boutique, that the premises for the Boutique had to have a number of changes and renovations. She had a slide pres entation to support the explanation of various steps needed in the process of converting the structure to the desired Boutique appearance and function.





Once the renovations for Hope's Closet Boutique was complete, Erica summarised the implementation of the collection of goods process, ideas for Funds support through the Butterfly Program

and Ladies centric focus planning and implementation.





At Hope's Closet Boutique they accept donations, working with volunteers to sell goods to raise money for non-profit organizations and charities in our community.

Erica finished her presentation by answering

questions from a number of Members.

Kiwanian Alex, formally thanked Erica for her presentation and noted that, in recognition of her presentation, we have made a donation to a Charity we like to support. That charity is the Brant Community Health Care System Foundation.
