Highlights of the Thursday, February 8, 2024 Weekly Meeting

President Alf got the meeting rolling on time, with the opening bell rung precisely at 12:00 noon followed by a welcome to special guest LG David MacLennan.



Following Thought for the Day by Alf, Joanne Murray moved to the lectern and reminded us Valentine's Day was just around the corner. She distributed colourful sheets of paper (red, of course) and asked those at each table to record their favourite love song and then we would hear from a representative at each table. Choices were heard from the 30's to the present, some stirring old memories, and others a laugh or two. Joanne promised to send each member a list of all the choices.





The draw was held next by Phil Hoekstra, with Nelson as the first unlucky candidate followed by

Flush from his moment of excitement, Nelson was up again to introduce a man who needs no introduction to this group, and always welcome, LG David MacLennan. David is a man, passionate about all aspects of education, and also about Kiwanis as this is his second time as Lieutenant Governor. David let us know we were going to hear about his current role as a Faculty Teaching Coach at Conestoga College. We saw a short conception video about teaching and learning and how they are being applied at Conestoga. As a coach he sits in on various

classes to observe the teaching style of the teacher. He completes a form covering details of what he has observed. At a later time he meets with the teacher to discuss his evaluation, one that covers the teacher's handling of course content as well as the process.

David offers suggestions on the "how" of presenting so that his audience pays attention, as well as how to deal with side discussions and other challenges in helping students learn. He believes in the approach of "I do,



we do, and you do". He stresses to the teacher he is observing, "We are colleagues and I'm here to support you". He discusses the oncoming unknown of AI and other filters that must be dealt with.

David then said he believed that all this can be applied to Kiwanis as well. It could allow us to look to see where we are as compared to where we should be, what the skills are that are missing, skills we should be seeking as we look for new members. On this note, David finished his presentation. He was thanked by Jim Steele following a few questions and answers.
