### Highlights of the Thursday, 18 January, 2024 Weekly Meeting

President Alfred Hauk called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM, welcoming all members and Guest Heather Vanner from Community Resource Service .

He indicated that he was continuing his opening comments from previous weeks, focusing on our "Objects of Kiwanis". This week would be, Object #2, which is, "To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all that we do". President Alfred said that, most of the major religions that he has studied have this particular tenet as a major belief. We should try to consider this Object on a daily basis.



Kiwanian Phil emceed the 50/50 Draw. He indicated that there were 37 cards in today's Deck. The potential winners were, ticket holders PG Joanne and Kiwanian Len. The Joker was not found and the pot continues to grow.






President Alfred thanked Kiwanis Phil and called up our PP Randy as the Funmaster for today. He opened with an amusing story set in 1990 about a young man and ATM machines when they were just coming into use. It was taken from a source called, "Stories with a Twist". He moved on helping us to celebrate Bonnie Little's Birthday on the 18 January and then opened the floor to Happy Stories and Happy Dollars. These were lead by PG Joanne and how her lost wallet was returned to her home before she got back from the Grocery store, Kiwanian Kirby and his signature on his daughters cheque, PP Randy and his Mother-in-Law mistaking and ATM as a Gambling Machine in Los Vagas and Kiwanian Len donating for his and Roma's



Wedding Anniversary last week and the fact that he had won a win-fall of a nice sum in the past week.

President Alfred, thanked Funmaster Randy and called VP Maureen to the podium to introduce our Guest Speaker today. VP Maureen introduced Heather Vanner who is the Executive Director of Community Resource Service, a community based, multi-service, charitable organization dedicated to helping people experiencing economic stress in Brantford and Brant County. Heather's topic for today relates to the increased need of food for people in our community..





Heather opened her presentation with the statement

that "Many news sources across Ontario have been sounding the alarm for the last year that Food Banks throughout the province do not have enough food for all the people that need it". The Brantford Food Bank was established as a temporary measure 35 years ago. Brantford in 2023 had 1 in 12 people who did not have enough food. This translates to 7,700 people, which is an increase of 45% over last year (2022). Statistics are hard to understand sometimes, but of these 7,700 people 33% are children and 10% are seniors. These numbers are similar to what we experienced in Brantford during the Recession in 2008.

Heather outlined many factors that support the reasons for these increases, and Covid is not a direct factor, as in fact Food Bank usage during that two year period actually declined. After covid, several factors have come into play that adversely impact all of our communities in Ontario.

# Not Enough. The Face of Hunger in Brantford

### Following are some key points:

- 1. Canada Emergency Response Benefit , now Cancelled
- 2. Ontario Basic Income Pilot, now cancelled
- 3. Food Prices have increased significantly
- 4. House Cost have risen significantly
- 5. Rental Costs have risen significantly
- 6. Single individual (Students) with no residence have iincreased.
- 7. Social Assistance Rate have not increased.
- 8. Wages are not increasing

#### Observations about Food Bank Users:

- Household users do not abuse the Food Bank.
   63% of the users go to the Food Bank 1 or 2 times each year.
- New Comers to Canada are not abusing the Food Bank. They represent < 10% of those in need.</li>
- 56% of the users are living alone.
- 52% have a private rental residence
- Food insecurity affects the overall health conditions, particulally in people who have dietary problems such as diabetes.

The Food Bank changed its model in Brantford in 2023: These changes allowed the "food needs" for each family to be adjusted base on the individual needs of the specific family. The model has been configured to be more like a super market, where a family member can select the type of food and quantity, base on their choice for their particular family.





Conclusion: The Food Banks of Ontario were originally set up as a temporary Social Safety Net, but it does not look like they are going away anytime soon.

Heather Vanner then answered a number of questions from our members after which, Kiwanian Paulette officially thanked Heather for her presentation noting that, "in recognition of her presentation, we had made a donation to a Charity we like to support. That charity is the Lansdowne Children's Centre Foundation.

The microphone was handed back to President Alfred who called for any Committee Reports or announcements.
