With a Library Card, which is free, people can access books, E-books, audio books, DVD's and emagazines. They also have sewing machines, fishing gear, and a bird watching kit to name but a few. The Library also has areas for Teens, Tweens and pre-Kindergarten containing materials to draw in children of all ages. There are printers and scanners for use by the public and a very special 3-D printer whose use is subject to a fee, depending on the complexity of the output. And to make is clear, the 3-D Printer is one of the few services for which they charge. All the rest are free with your library card. There are also many databases of information for such things as newspapers, consumer health and genealogy. And most of these services can be used online by logging into the Library's website app, Libby (again, free with your library card).

There were a number of questions for Tom when he finished his presentation after which Karen Adams gave a gracious thank you speech.
