KIWANIS YOUTH WRITERS CONTEST RULES

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

The Kiwanis Youth Writers Contest is open to elementary and high school students in Grades 4 to 12 as of September 9, 2024, who are attending a school or being taught in a home-school

environment in Brantford, Brant, or Six Nations.

Submissions will be accepted for unpublished short fiction stories on the theme of "My

Neighbourhood."

The submission must be an original, unpublished piece of fictional work. Only one submission per

author will be accepted.

The submission must be written by a single author. Co-authored submissions will not be accepted.

The submission must be available in English, whether written originally in English or originally

written in another language but translated into English.

Poetry or academic essays will not be accepted.

Do not submit any images.

Submissions created using artificial intelligence tools or using materials taken from other sources,

regardless of medium, are not acceptable and will be disqualified. However, using spellcheck and

other digital proofreading tools is acceptable and encouraged.

Entries that do not meet these requirements will be subject to disqualification.

CATEGORIES:

Submissions will be judged in the following categories:

SENIOR

Grades 10, 11 and 12

INTERMEDIATE

Grades 7, 8 and 9

JUNIOR

Grades 4, 5 and 6.

WORD LIMIT:

The word limit for submissions, which must be strictly observed, are:

SENIOR

1200 words

INTERMEDIATE

800 words

JUNIOR

500 words.

The word count includes "a," "an," and "the". Failing to observe the maximum word limit will result in disqualification.

PRIZES:

SENIOR First place - \$1,000; Second place - \$500; Third place - \$250. INTERMEDIATE First place - \$500; Second place - \$250; Third place - \$150 JUNIOR First place - \$250; Second place - \$200; Third place - \$125.

Winning entries will be posted on the Kiwanis Club of Brantford website for a duration of 12 months.

JUDGING:

Entries will be judged blind.

As a general overview of judging criteria, submissions will be assessed on:

- The originality and creativity of the story on the theme of "My neighbourhood"; and
- The manner in which the story is told (as examples, point of view, form and structure, use of language).

Spelling and grammar will be considered as part of the assessment.

Any communication with the contest judges will compromise the blind judging process and will result in disqualification.

The decisions of the judges are final.

DEADLINE:

The deadline for submission is October 18, 2024, at 11:59 p.m.

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR STORY:

To enter the information about your story can access the Website by:

1) Entering **BrantfordKiwanis.org** in the address field for your browser and then press Enter.

This will take to the Home page of the Kiwanis Website where you will see a menu item along the top menu "Youth Writer's Contest".

Click on these words and you will be taken to the contest landing page which will give you links, to the "Rules and Guidelines" or the "Registration Form Page".

- 2) Once you have read and understand the Rules and Guidelines needed to enter the contest you can move on by Clicking the text "Go to Registration Form Page".
- 3) After arriving on the Registration Form be sure to fill in all fields with your correct information and attach you story before Submitting the form.

When the form is accepted you will receive a short notice, "Thanks for your entry, we will contact you shortly".

Entries must be made by either the parent or guardian of the minor author of the submission or by the author's teacher with the author's parent or guardian's permission.

Because entries are judged blind, please do not put your name on your story

Entries must be submitted in MS Word (DOC or DOCX). Please use standard margins, Calibri 12-point font and double spacing.
