Kiwanian Faye mentioned that she was please to see so many wonderful costumes on our members and got everyone into the Halloween spirit by posing a number of questions to the members such as:

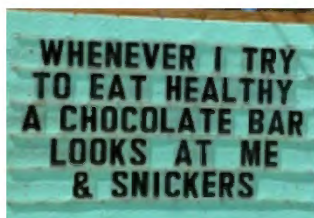
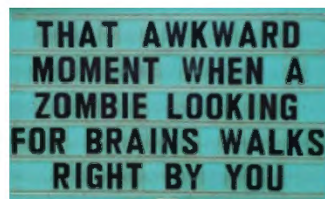
- What was the weight of the worlds largest pumpkin pie? **Answer:** 3,699 lbs.
