Anne Marie Peirce was welcome warmly, and gave us a short background about her experience and how the Brant Community Foundation had continued its development.

Anne Marie opened with an overview of the purpose of the Brant Community Foundation followed by details about the Vital signs report.

## What is Vital Signs?

Vital Signs is Canada's most extensive community-driven data program. Spearheaded by Community Foundations of Canada and led by community foundations in Canada and around the world.

- Brant's Vital Signs is a snapshot of the community at a point in time using data points from the most recent census and other sources.
- It uses demographic information representing key indicators for our local communities, which include Brantford, Brant County, Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.
- The 10 key community vitality indicators tell a story about the current issues in our area.
- Indicators include public safety, health and wellness, economy, environment and more.



- Support and/or conduct research to understand the root causes of local challenges and potential solutions.
- Advocate for policy change and for funding for needed supports and services.
- Focus granting, donations, and volunteering towards issues identified in the report.
