

Highlights of the Thursday, 29 May, 2025 Weekly Meeting

Acting Chair Ken McNaughton, welcomed all members and Guest Speaker Stan Hutchinson from the Kiwanis Paris-Brant Club.

Ken opened the meeting with Funmistress, Faye Prince





This is a story about the creation of "My Way," a song that has indeed touched countless lives. It's clear that it is one of the most beautiful songs of our time.

Paul Anka, despite his own string of hits, was initially "terrified" to write for Sinatra, a testament to Sinatra's immense stature and influence. This fear, and the way it was overcome, adds another layer to the song's legend.

The detailed account of Sinatra's "retirement" announcement, Anka's late-night inspiration, and the rapid composition (four hours!) truly highlights the extraordinary creative spark that led to the song. The image of Anka hearing the melody from France and then channeling Sinatra's persona to write the lyrics is particularly vivid.

Paul Anka recalled a story about a Chinese colleague in Beijing singing "My Way" with perfect English and Sinatra's inflections, is a powerful testament to the song's ability to transcend cultural and language barriers and evoke deep personal meaning. It showcases how universally resonant the song's message of living life on one's own terms is.

The video presented, is an excellent setting for anyone to appreciate "My Way", not just as a song, but as a significant cultural artifact born from a unique collaboration and a moment of pure inspiration. It truly encourages the listener to approach the music with a deeper understanding and appreciation.


After the Video Faye passed the microphone back to Kem MacNaughton.

Ken McNaughton introduced our speaker Stan Hutchinson from the Paris-Brant Club who will talk about local bike trails and all they have to offer.

Stan Hutchinson opened his presentation using personal safety and his experience, energitically describing the benefits and freedom of using the many kilometers of trails offered freely in our area. He used his experience and a powerpoint presentation to provide visual and spoken emphasis.

The SC Johnson Trail, a popular 9-mile (14 km) path, connects Brantford and Paris, offering scenic views and cycling opportunities. This trail follows an old railway bed and features stone dust surfacing, making it suitable for both cycling and hiking. The trail passes through farm fields, prairie grasslands, and provides views of the Grand River. Stan covered many details and presented information that may get some of us out and about to enjoy the community we live in with the possibility of improving our own health.
