The Crow Mystery

Researchers for the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority found over 200 dead crows near greater Boston recently. A Bird Pathologist examined the remains of all the crows, and, to everyone's relief, confirmed the problem was definitely NOT Avian Flu. The cause of death appeared to be vehicular impacts.






The Brant Community Healthcare System's Mission, Vision and Values has four pillars

BCHS Capital Planning History has been planning for the redevelopment of its facilities for 16 years. (With little advancement)

A Pre-Capital submission was made 10 years ago in 2014, with resubmission in 2015, 2017, 2020, finally attaining a capital planning grant in March 2022 based on government approval to plan. The Stage 1.2 Proposal was developed and submitted in October 2023.


The March 2022 Planning Grant funding agreement involved planning parameters to redevelop on the existing BGH site and to maximize reuse of the existing facilities. A new greenfield site for BGH was not part of these parameters despite previous proposals and advocacy.

On May 15, 2025 Additional Planning Grant & Permission to Plan on Greenfield Site.

BCHS will receive an additional \$12.5 million planning grant to plan on a greenfield site.
