- Acting on behalf of the Governor as his or her representative in the Division
- Promoting the achievement of the District Goals and Distinguished Program for the administrative year
- Communicating the mission, vision, and direction of the Kiwanis organization and the District.
- Working closely with club presidents to ensure they feel supported and informed about their responsibilities as outlined in the club leadership training.
- Holding a quarterly discussion with each club president in the division, to recognize accomplishments and develop remedial plans to address identified concerns
- Supporting existing clubs, maintain and increase their membership
- Engaging club coaches to help underperforming or sub-strength clubs achieve their goals
- Taking a lead role identifying at least one potential new sustainable club location in the division
- Being a resource for the new club builder assigned to the division, to open one or more clubs
- Holding a minimum of three Divisional Caucus meetings during the administrative year
- Developing, leading and utilizing a strong and effective divisional leadership team
- Continually mentoring the Division's Lieutenant-Governor-elect
- Holding division elections in accordance with Section 7, Section 5 of the District Bylaws

LG Randy detailed the following Goals by Category, for each Club in 2025-2026 Division 5

Membership and Engagement

- Achievement of a minimum net gain of two (2) new members by September 30, 2026
- Sponsorship of 1 new club in the Division
- Completion of a Membership Satisfaction Survey by clubs whose last survey was prior to September 30, 2022 and create an action plan accordingly by May 2026
- Development and implementation of a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Club Policy by January 2026



Service

- Submission by every Club in the Division of their Signature Project information to the Kiwanis International Signature Project Contest by January 31, 2026
- Participation by a minimum of 5 clubs in "Division 5 Kiwanis Kindness Week" April 19th to 25th

Attendance of 90% of the required participants in Club Leadership Education - incoming President, President-elect, Vice President - if this position is listed in bylaws, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership Chair (Governor Cynthia's goals and a criterion for Distinguished Recognition)

- Delivery of a "How To" education item at each Divisional Council Meeting of the year
- Participation of 3 delegates in accordance with the District Bylaws, from each Club in the Division at the District Convention in Toronto, Ontario April 30 to May 2, 2026
