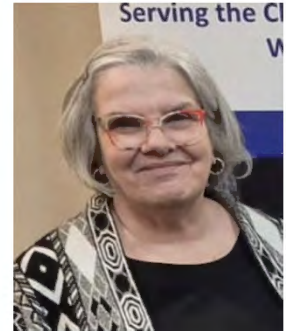


## Highlights of the Thursday, 08 January, 2026 Weekly Meeting

Nelson McClinchey Introduced Simran Shoker, who has been a member of our club for 5 years, is a mother of two active young boys, is a Licence Realtor and a licenced Paralegal. Nelson welcomed Simran to the podium.

Simran Shoker welcome everyone and thanked the Club for inviting her to explain, what a paralegal is.

Simran used a slide presentation as she explained, who are Paralegal in Ontario and their Roles, responsibilities & differences.

She indicated that a Paralegal is:

- A licensed legal professional
- Regulated by the Law Society of Ontario
- Authorized to offer legal services and advice
- May represent clients independently
- Focused on everyday legal problems people actually face
- Mostly deal with smaller legal problems faced by people
- More affordable than Lawyers

Where Paralegals Can Represent Clients:

Paralegals are licensed to appear in:

1. Small Claims Court
  - Civil disputes involving money
  - Contract issues, unpaid invoices
  - Limit is now \$50,000 (This was recently changed from \$35,000 to \$50,000)
2. Personal injury claims
  - Accident benefits = no-fault statutory benefits under SABS
  - Cover medical costs, income replacement, caregiver support
    - Disputes go to Licence Appeal Tribunal (LAT)
3. Workplace Safety Tribunals (WSIB)
  - Workplace injury claims
  - Benefit entitlement disputes (within licensing scope)
4. Other Administrative Tribunals
  - Regulatory & licensing hearings
  - Minor criminal matters within defined limits



Simran explained:

Why Paralegals Exist:

- Improve access to justice
- Offer affordable representation
- Support people navigating systems alone
- Help reduce court backlogs
- Provide practical, timely legal solutions

### How to Become a Paralegal

1. Complete a Law Society–approved paralegal diploma (generally, 2 years)
2. Finish a supervised field placement
3. Apply for and pass the LSO licensing exam
4. Obtain professional liability insurance
5. Register as a licensed Paralegal
6. Complete ongoing continuing education

### Paralegal vs. Lawyer

#### Lawyers

- Law degree + articling
- Can practice in all areas of law
- Handle family law, immigration, wills, real estate, corporate law, complex criminal files

#### Paralegals

- Specialized college diploma (There is also a 4 year Paralegal Degree Program at Humber College)
- Scope limited to approved areas
- Focus on everyday legal issues
- Often more cost-effective and efficient

### The Bigger Picture

#### Paralegals support:

- Small businesses
  - Tenants and landlords
  - Consumers & workers
  - New Canadians
  - People priced out of legal help
- Paralegals make legal help **accessible**
