WHAT IS THE 2024-25 PNW DISTRICT PROJECT?

Chosen by District Governor Isabella Baldisseri and approved by the District Board, this project is intended to educate Key Clubbers and Kiwanians about the opportunities in their local communities to aid youth experiencing houselessness. Together, we can positively impact the lives of houseless youth in our communities.

SEAD stands for Support, Empower, Act, and Destigmatize.

WHY YOUTH HOUSELESSNESS?

- Experiencing houselessness transforms the lives of youth. They face significantly higher rates of emotional, behavioral, and health problems.
- Youth houselessness is prevalent in communities throughout the PNW District.
- There are countless ways to help. Key Clubbers from any area can contribute and address the needs of their community as they see fit.

BY THE NUMBERS

BIPOC youth face an 83% increased risk of houselessness.

LGBTQIA+ people are 120% more likely to be unhoused after coming out.

Indigenous youth are more than twice as likely to be unhoused.

30% of unhoused people are under the age of 24.
