

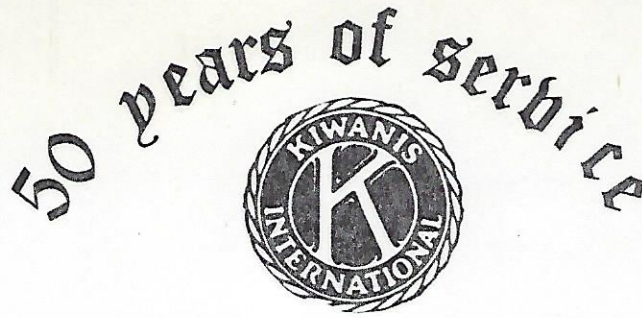

A Charter Member of the Coldwater Kiwanis Club, of Coldwater, Mi. Rolph was born May 18th, 1910 in Coldwater Mi. He has lived in Coldwater all his life. He graduated from Coldwater High School and then attended M.S.U. where he received his Degree in Chemical Engineering. This being the time of the depression, engineers were not in demand, so Rolph found a position with Branch County Bank, in Coldwater and stayed there for the next 45 years, retiring as Vice President and member of the Board of Directors.

Rolph met and married Helen Norberg of New Era, Mi., and they raised three daughters, Mary, Ann, & Dorothy. Rolph and his son-in-law, Charles Young, purchased the Carlisle Co. in 1949 and it is still in operation. They make the Carlisle Fishing Bobber, which is well known in the sporting world. Rolph's wife, Helen, passed away a few years ago and he has since married, Vesta Kemp.

Rolph's life has been one of service to the community. He has been a member of the United Methodist Church for many years, has served on the Board, has been treasurer, and many other duties. He has served on the Board of the local Library, the Tibbits Opera House, and the Board of Public Utilities. His love of young people led him to helping the Boy Scouts. He is a strong supporter of Starr Commonwealth and Youth Haven Ranch.

After fifty years, Rolph is the only Charter member left in the club. He was the club Treasurer the first 13 years of the club. He served as President in 1958, then served as treasurer for several years until 1984. He also has been on the board of directors several times and is still on the board. A dedicated Kiwanian all his Kiwanis years.

Because of his service to the club and the community, the Board of Directors at their Feb. Meeting, voted to recommend Rolph Carlisle for the Honor of Distinguished Kiwanian. This honor to be presented to him at the 50th Anniversary Party to be held May 4th, 1985.
