CECIL C. BRUTON joined the Kiwanis Club of Strathmoor,
Detroit, in April, 1942, and served as President in 1949.
He was elected Lieutenant Governor of Division #1 in 1951,
and at the Ann Arbor District Convention in 1953 he was
elected District Governor. In his acceptance speech he
announced the motto for his administrative year would be
"Let's Do More in '54".

An outstanding achievement of his year as Governor was the building of twelve new clubs. The International Committee on Achievement awarded the 'Bruton Year' first place in the Silver Section -- a fitting climax to a great community service effort throughout the Michigan District.

Cecil was born on a farm near Sarnia, Ontario, August 8, 1899. He married Hazel in 1922 and they moved to Detroit in 1923 where for 14 years Cecil worked for the J. F. Weber Lumber Company. In 1937 he entered the real estate business and developed one of the largest and most successful firms in the Detroit area. He was Past President of the United Northwest Realty Association, one of the founders of the Metropolitan Savings Association, and Vice-Chairman of its Board of Directors. Cecil passed away on October 8, 1974.
