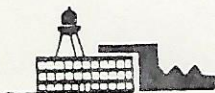

Under his leadership, we won the single service award in the Diamond division. Jim held many committee positions in the club including Chairman of the Stadium Committee. Jim was also an active member of the Michigan District having served as a Trustee of the Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation during 1978-1979. He was president of the Foundation during the year 1982-1983. Jim was serving as Lt. Governor for Division 3 at the time of his death.

Jim was a Kiwanian in the truest sense of the word. He served his community in many ways. He served as both Board member and President of the Board of the Rochester YMCA. He coached YMCA basketball. Jim was a member of Civic Searchlight serving on the committee to evaluate political candidates in Southeastern Michigan. Jim was an active member of St. Pauls United Methodist Church. Jim also served in the Michigan National Guard from 1960 through 1969 and again from 1973 through 1978. Jim was awarded the Stewart Medal as the Soldier of the Year in 1978.
