FRANK E. JEANNETTE

- 1933 - Frank joined the Kiwanis Club of East Detroit on December 13, 1933 and has a record of perfect attendance.

Among his many awards and recognitions:

- July 1976 - In recognition of distinguished public service, help and concern for Americans of Italian origin, the Italian Government bestowed upon Judge Jeannette, the title of "Commendatore". This is the highest award given to an American of Italian Heritage.
- Oct. 1981 - A new Junior High School in Sterling Heights, Michigan was named the Frank E. Jeannette Junior High School.
