The Kiwanis Club of Petoskey, on the seventy-fifth anniversary of Kiwanis International, is both pleased and honored to nominate its long-time Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. David L. Meyer, as a Distinguished Kiwanian.

In 1968, soon after he returned from two years of military service in Korea, David L. Meyer became the third generation of the Meyer family to join Kiwanis. Previously, his grandfather was a charter member of the Kiwanis Club of Charlevoix, and later, his father became a member of the Kiwanis Club of Petoskey. David's father served as President and Secretary of the Petoskey club, and eventually represented the Michigan District of Kiwanis as a Lieutenant Governor.

David has served as the Secretary-Treasurer of the Kiwanis Club of Petoskey since his induction in 1968. During this period of 22 years, he has maintained a perfect attendance record and has been recognized as a Distinguished Secretary 9 times. He is also the publisher of the club's award-winning weekly bulletin and has served as Chairman of the Petoskey club's Travelogue Series (one of the major fund-raising projects conducted by our Kiwanis Club to support worthwhile community services).

David's ardent and dedicated membership in Kiwanis has earned him recognition throughout Division 22 for his leadership in helping to organize several Kiwanis Clubs within the Michigan District. He has willingly and effectively represented his club at ten Kiwanis International conventions, and in 1983-84, he was elected by the officers of the 22nd Division of the Michigan District to represent them as Lieutenant Governor.

For several years David has been an active leader in many of the activities of the Michigan District of Kiwanis. Since 1983, he has been Division 22 Trustee for the Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation, and he is currently Division 22 Administrative Manager of the Herman H. Meyer Project (which helps the medical teams that care for the Neo-natal Clinic) at Northern Michigan Hospital. In 1987, David was elected by his peers to serve as Secretary-Treasurer of the Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation.

David's wife, Sandi, has been at his side in all of his Kiwanis activities, as well as in numerous church functions. They have four children, two girls and two boys. Professionally, David is the manager of the Public Letter Shop, an accounting and administrative service started in Petoskey by his mother in 1959.

The Kiwanis Club of Petoskey is proud and grateful for the many selfless services provided by David L. Meyer to help others during his 22 years as a Kiwanian. "Service to others" has characterized his Kiwanis life, and we hope, eminently qualifies him for the designation of "Distinguished Kiwanian".
