Serving through his local club, Blue Grass of Kentucky, of Lexington and the Kentucky-Tennessee District, he moved from club president to Lieutenant Governor of the Division. The District then pressed him into service as its Secretary and on to Governor. Ted has the distinction of being the first International President to get his start as a member of Key Club International.

Here he serves those about him as Chairman of the Airport Zoning Board of Appeals in Lexington; Chairman of the Selective Service Board; Past President of the Lexington Sub-Dividers Association and on the Board of Counselors of Oxford College of Emory University.

Acceptance of civic, social and political responsibilities has led to a labyrinth of paths toward service. He is Chairman of the City-County Civil Defense Committee and former Civil Defense Director. Ted is President of the Community Recreation Association. He is Founder and Past President of Lexington Junior Achievement and once served on Junior Achievement's National Board. He is Regional Board member of the Boy Scouts of America; a Past President of the Y.M.C.A.; a Past President of the President's Civic Roundtable; former Campaign Chairman of the United Community Fund; past State Chairman of the Easter Seals Campaign; a Past President of Transylvania College National Alumni Association; a Past President of the Y's Men's Club; a Past President of the Big Brothers of Lexington, a member of Big Brothers National Board, and is Regional Vice-President of Big Brothers of America.

Ted served two terms in the Kentucky State Legislature and was once Vice-Chairman of the State Commission of Higher Education.
