\* Introduction of the use of "Stars & Circles" on membership badges to recognize services rendered by members.

\* Use of "Numbered Color Coded Table Designators" to assure members sit at different tables each week to eliminate cliques.

\* Over the years, serving as chairman of Club Programs, Education, Growth & Retention and as Historian.

\* Participation in club activities including: Immunization Program, Special Olympics, Roger's Dept. Store Fishing Derby & Christmas Shopping, Salvation Army Bell Ringing & delivering "Gifts of Cheer", publishing the Photo Directories of GK of GR, Adopt-A-Road Clean-up, being "Grandpa" to 3rd & 4th Grade Children with Learning Disabilities & other events.

Roger's dedication to the service of others is not limited to Kiwanis activities. He has served the American Red Cross as a driver one day a week for the past 14 years. In 1987, he was awarded the ARC Nancy Evenson Award for "Voluntary Contributions in Community Service Programs". In 1991, the Grand Rapids branch of the Red Cross established the Roger F. Dykhuis Annual Award for Voluntary Services in the Transportation Dept. In 1995, he was presented the John P. Otte Award at the Red Cross honor banquet for Outstanding Voluntary Contribution in the Community.

His advice to all Kiwanis leaders is: "Keep members involved and your club will grow. At our club we call on members to contribute...whether it is to be working on a committee or project, invocator, song leader, or parking lot attendant...the more they do, the more they enjoy the Kiwanian experience."
