DISTINGUISHED KIWANIAN CLARENCE S. JUSTICE

Mr. Clarence S. Justice was born in Greece, New York. After serving with the Armed Forces in World War I, he studied for the ministry and became an ordained minister. He came to Dearborn early in 1928 to become pastor of the First Baptist Church of Dearborn.

Clare joined the Dearborn Kiwanis Club as a charter member when it was organized in 1928. He was club president in 1932. Through the years, he has maintained a dedicated participation in club affairs and in 1976 he was one of the charter members still active in the club. He is still very faithful in club attendance and participates actively in social affairs, sporting events and associated club projects for the betterment of his community.

In addition to his pastoral duties, he was associated with the Dearborn Press as Advertising Manager, News and Editorial writer during the era known as the Great Depression. He was active in numerous causes during this period, when 50% of the people in Dearborn were on relief, to lighten the hardships endured by these people.

He became owner and proprietor of Justice Insurance Agency in 1934 and continued this activity until he retired in 1965.

Over the years, Clare Justice has been involved in countless community and civic functions, both as a member of the Dearborn Kiwanis Club and as a private businessman and good citizen. He has been Executive Secretary of the Dearborn Community Chest, organized the legal dental and medical aid programs, helped organize visiting nurses aid and legal aid and personal receivership aid through the local courts. He also found time to serve as Kiwanis District Trustee, helped organize and charter the Dearborn-East Kiwanis Club, served as secretary-treasurer of his home club, organized the club's past-presidents club and served as its secretary for twenty years, organized and was vice-president of the Boys Club of Dearborn, and he was a charter member of the Dearborn Elks Club.

Clare Justice has been a true Kiwanian for nearly a half century to date. He has been a leader in club projects and his consistently given inspiration to the younger club members for achieving the goals of Kiwanis.
