Robert F. Weber, a partner in a Detroit investment and real estate firm, and the fifth-third President of Kiwanis International, was elected to that position during the organization's Fifty-Fourth Annual Convention in Miami-Miami Beach, Florida.

Prior to his election to the presidential post, he served one year as president-elect, one year as treasurer, one year as vice-president, and four years (two two-year terms) as trustee of Kiwanis International. He has also been president of the Detroit No. 1 Kiwanis Club, lieutenant governor and governor of the Michigan Kiwanis District, and both member and chairman of several district committees. In addition, he has been both a member and chairman of the Kiwanis International Committees on Support of Churches in Their Spiritual Aims, and Public and Business Affairs for the United States. He has been chairman of the Committee on Programs and Music and a member of the Special International Committee on Golden Anniversary. As president, he was chairman of the Executive Committee of the International Board of Trustees.

Weber is active in a wide variety of professional, community, and service efforts in addition to his Kiwanis work. He is a director and member of the Executive Committee of the Standard Federal Savings and Loan Association; past chairman of the City of Detroit's Mayor's Building Code Committee on Enforcement; and past director, City of Detroit Committee on Neighborhood Conservation and United Community Services Board, Detroit. He has been a trustee of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan and chairman of the Finance Committee. Weber has also served as president, treasurer, and trustee of the Grosse Pointe, Michigan Board of Education and as trustee of the Village of Grosse Pointe Shores. He is past president of Goodwill Industries of Greater Detroit, and a current member on its National Board. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the National Kidney Foundation. Weber is a trustee of the Bishop Page Foundation, Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, and a trustee of Olivet College. He is also a former member of the Foundation for Exceptional Children of Grosse Pointe, Inc., and a former director, Detroit Area Council, Boy Scouts of America.
