ARCHIE N. CASE KIWANIS CLUB OF JACKSON 1882-1932

Mr. Archie N. Case served as President of the Kiwanis Club of Jackson in 1922 and as Governor of Kiwanis of Michigan in 1928.

He was an early industrialist in the City of Jackson, devoting many active years to the young Kiwanis Club of Jackson as well as to a relatively young international Kiwanis organization.

He helped build the Kiwanis Lodge south of Jackson off Stonewall Road. It was a large lodge with a fireplace to take eight-foot logs, but unfortunately the lodge burned within a year and was never rebuilt.

During his year as Governor, Kiwanis of Michigan founded the Kiwanis Forest near Tawas along the Au Sable River. Kiwanis members and citizens, by donation, made it possible to buy and plant thousands of seedlings which are now full-grown trees.

Mr. & Mrs. Case had one child, Meirodine, who remembers her father's love of Kiwanis and she is desirous of having the Kiwanis Club of Jackson so honor her father. The Kiwanis Club of Jackson is proud to sponsor one of its leading citizens and a pioneer in Kiwanis service.
