Dr. Charles F. Wolf was born in Amboy Township, Hillsdale County, Michigan, December 15, 1880. He attended Ypsilanti Normal College (now Eastern Michigan University), Hillsdale College, Olivet College and Chicago Veterinary College. While at Normal College he played football, and at Hillsdale he earned two medals in wrestling. He graduated from Chicago Veterinary College in 1912, with honors in Chemistry, Biochemistry and Anatomy. He was also class Valedictorian and President. Later, he received his degree in Theology and entered active ministry in the Congregational Church.

He was a member of the First Congregational Church of Ypsilanti, Washtenaw Academy of Veterinary Medicine and the Michigan & American Veterinary Medical Association. He was also a member of the Kiwanis International Legion of Honor for over 30 years and received their award for 25 years of perfect attendance. He was very proud of his record.

For several years he was Head Biologist at Parke-Davis & Co. Research Laboratory at Rochester, Michigan.

He was a member of the Ypsilanti, Michigan Kiwanis Club for 22 years, with a perfect attendance record. After deciding that the members of that Club were too old, he became a member of the Greater Ypsilanti Club in September, 1967. He served well and worked on all projects until his passing on May 14, 1974 at Bixby Hospital, Adrian, Michigan.

Not long before his passing, he attended a meeting of the Kiwanis Club at Dayton, Ohio where he had been a member. His message to his fellow Kiwanians concluded, "I vouch for the integrity of every Kiwanian, and, as I sit at my desk and look at the sunsets in the evenings, I say a silent prayer for all of you."
