Circle K International for college students: University of Waterloo students Cesar Arriojas and Shradhaa Srikanth have relaunched the University of Waterloo Circle K club. The club already has a roster of over two dozen members. Most college students leave the Waterloo Region for the summer months, but Circle K volunteers joined our members this month to help make Kids Day a big success. Thank you Circle K !

Circle K International (CKI) is the largest student-run volunteer organization of its kind, with over 12,600 members on over 500 campuses in 17 countries. CKI mirrors the mandate of Kiwanis at the university level in making our community a better place to live, through service, with a special emphasis on helping children.
