
Vernon Brown gave an end-of-year recap of the club's activities for Kiwanis Family House:







Len delivered our program to give us an update on the Giving Tree Project. The idea for this project came to Len in April, 2020, while reading an article in Kiwanis Magazine on planting trees. He thought our club could start a project in tree planting, and the timing would help celebrate "the end of COVID by Fall". He was talking to Heidi Sanborn, to schedule a program about SMUD, and they began talking about trees. The Giving Tree Project Committee began and started making plans. The committee includes Len, Heidi, Linda M, Sharon, Mike, Wayne, Sheba, Donna, and Judee. This would be a good committee for some of our newer members to join! The goal was to plant trees at Cameron Ranch and Schweitzer elementary schools. Alas, COVID restrictions continued and the plans had to be postponed.

There was a successful tree planting at La Sierra Community Center (benefiting both CRPD and CMP School) of 9 trees in October 2021. In March 2022, 24 trees were planted at Larchmont Park. The third planting project was at Cameron Ranch Elementary, with 12 trees. We had 49 volunteers! Community Sponsors included the Sacramento Tree Foundation, CRPD staff, SJUSD M & O, SMUD, Coalition for Clean Air (two grants). We received a \$950 grant from Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha District Foundation.

Our goal is two tree plantings in 2023. We need to be able to rent a more powerful auger to pre-dig holes, and we plan to distribute Giving Tree books to children. Pictured is Len Ohlendorf and Heidi Sanborn.

K-Kids Invite Ukrainian Family to General Meeting

The C.C. Coppin Elementary School K-Kids invited a Ukraine Family, who escaped from a border town near Belarus during the first Russian invasion, to their General Meeting.

The K-Kids board voted on honoring the commitment they made last year to donate \$200 to supporting Ukraine families. Although the budget is tight, they all responded with resounding a "Yes"!

A mother of the Ukraine family of four children responded to a K-Kids Question: "What was it like living in Ukraine"?







She said that Life in Ukraine is very different. She could set out the children's school clothes and they could get ready and go to school on their own because it was a safe place to live. Cars drove slowly in the village and kids could walk on their own to the store or church safely. The family was very close, and she and her husband wanted the children to know about taking care of their fields, horses, chickens and pigs. Everything was different in Ukraine.

The family and their four children escaped the war by having a full tank of gas because they were all going to the dentist 30 miles away. Their escape route went to Poland, Germany, Cancun Mexico and crossed the border in Tijuana. They ended up in Loomis where the K-Kids teacher's brother gave the father a job. When the K-Kids president presented them with the \$200, the family had a little conversation amongst themselves and asked if it would be okay if they sent the money back to friends and family in Ukraine. The family said that they were comfortable here with a job, a place to live, and clothes and food. They said the money was most needed in Ukraine and the American dollar is worth more there. It was an incredible story and the K-Kids were beyond impressive with the way they handled the meeting and all the questions they asked.


OH MY!!! What a meeting on Tuesday! I hope you have had time to talk to your students about this inspiring and tender story this amazing family of four children ages 11, 6, 5 and 3 have experienced these last 10 months. Their escape from Ukraine hiding from tanks, trying to drive on a road that was now using all lanes to Poland with abandoned cars that had run out of gas. To flying to Cancun because that was the only way they could leave Poland. Then having all of their papers taken at the Mexico border. Staying at the border for one week and then finally arriving in the Sacramento Area with nothing but the clothes on their back. They shared all of the good people had done for them, which was hard, because in the Ukraine they always tried to help others and now they were receiving the help. Then they ending our meeting by asking if the money we gave them could be used for their families that are still in the war. We were all so touched.

Mr. Ron Smith, my brother, introduced the family and gave a little background and then the K-Kids asked questions. The questions these amazing, young students asked were mind boggling. How could these kiddos even have a clue about what this family had gone through. But their questions were thoughtful, kind, and really on the mark. The family was so impressed with our K-Kids! All of the adults present were astonished by these K-Kids! In the future we will be having a money drive to support Ukrainian families as one of our service projects this year.

Division Inter-Club Meetings

Inter-Club: An inter-club meeting is a meeting or activity staged by two or more Kiwanis family clubs including Division Council Meetings, Kiwanis Club, Circle K, Key Club, Builders Club, K-Kids, Aktion Club, Conferences & Conventions.

The definition of an inter-club was expanded from simply attending another Kiwanis club meeting to include attending Fundraisers, Projects, Activities and Social Events of another K-Family Club.

The broadened definition promotes more opportunities for fellowship, education and encourages greater interaction between **Kiwanis Clubs and our Service Leadership Programs**:

- Clubs with 20 or Fewer Members need a minimum of <u>two</u> members in attendance to constitute an Inter-Club Meeting.
- Clubs with 21-30 of three members need a minimum of three members attendance to constitute an Inter-Club Meeting.
- Clubs with 31 or More Members need a minimum of <u>four</u> members in attendance to constitute an Inter-Club Meeting.

Visiting groups shall be composed of a minimum of two Kiwanians plus members of K-Kids, Builders Club, Aktion Club, Circle K, or Key Club must be in attendance. A Lieutenant Governor can only be included if they are a member of the participating club.

Inter-Clubbing is a means of supporting Kiwanis' Fifth Object, which is "To provide, through this club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community".

Through the fellowship gained by inter-club activities, members learn how other clubs function, get to know their neighboring Kiwanians, develop new ideas and a broader interest in how Kiwanis operates, find new ideas for use in their own club, and become better Kiwanians.

Inter-Clubbing creates fun and strong fellowship.
