To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and good will.

#### Notes from President Designate Phil Requejo

I'll start with a small confession: I wasn't a Kev Club or KIWINS member in high school nor Circle K in college. I knew who they were those standout students organizing events, raising funds, volunteering with a smile but back then, I guess I was focused on other things (probably less noble, definitely less organized, and probably far less productive!). At the time, I appreciated what they represented, but I didn't fully realize the impact those early seeds of service could grow into later in life.

Fast forward a few decades, and here I am - a relatively new member of the Kiwanis Club of Downey, wondering why it took me so long to find my way here. I had been asked to join Kiwanis several times in the past, but like many busy professionals, I always managed to find a reason to defer: "Maybe later, when work slows down," or "Maybe after this project is completed." (Guess what: the work never really slows down.)

What finally convinced me? It wasn't a grand epiphany — it was the people. During my time working in Downey, I was lucky to meet and work alongside so many wonderful individuals, many of whom were Kiwanians. Over time, I saw how deeply Kiwanis supported the Downey community, and in particular, Rancho Los Amigos and the patients we serve. Kiwanis was there



 quietly, faithfully, making a difference without needing fanfare or applause.

As the CEO of Rancho Research Institute at Rancho. whose mission is to improve the lives of people with disabilities, I realized that Kiwanis wasn't a separate path from my professional journey — it was a natural extension of it. The ideals of service, community, and compassion that drive Kiwanis are the same ideals that led me to Rancho more than 25 years ago. Joining Downey Kiwanis didn't feel like starting something new — it felt like continuing something important. It just made sense.

When I reflect on why I joined and what I hoped to gain, I'll be honest — I did not have a checklist of personal benefits or professional goals. I didn't join to network or to build a résumé. I joined because it felt like the right thing to do. I joined because every time I attended a Kiwanis event or spoke with a member, I left feeling more hopeful about the world than when I arrived.

That kind of positive energy is rare — and it's contagious.

What I appreciate most about Kiwanis is that it's a place where you don't have to "hustle." You don't have to put on airs or constantly sell yourself. You show up, you serve, and you connect — authentically. It reminds me why community truly matters. That's something you can't put a price on

To all the longtime Kiwanis members — I salute you! Your commitment and experience are inspiring, and I look forward to learning from each of you as I continue to find my footing. And to those who are newer or still thinking about joining but might feel hesitant because you don't have a long history with Kiwanis — trust me, it's okay. Whether you're a seasoned Kiwanis scholar with a chest full of pins or someone still trying to memorize the "Hail Kiwanis" club song, there's room for all of us. Jump in, learn as you go, and enjoy the journey. You never know you might even get voted in to be the next president of the Downey Kiwanis Club!

At the end of the day, being part of Downey Kiwanis reminds me that community service isn't about having a perfect résumé or a long list of accolades. It's about showing up, lending a hand, sharing a laugh, and building something bigger than yourself. I'm grateful to be part of it — and excited for the journey ahead.
