

How To Start a Key Club

Steps to starting a Key Club:

Key Club International's How to Start or Reactivate a Key Club

- 1. Find a Kiwanis Club to sponsor the proposed Key Club.
 - a. Have the sponsoring Kiwanis Club identify a Kiwanis Advisor for the Key Club. See the Complete Kiwanis & Faculty Key Club Advisor Guide for details.
- 2. Find a high school interested in opening a Key Club
 - a. Have the school identify a Faculty Advisor for the Key Club. See the <u>Complete</u> Kiwanis & Faculty Key Club Advisor Guide for details.
- 3. Faculty Advisor (with Kiwanis Club's support) recruits members and collects \$13.50/member.
 - a. You need at least 11 members to charter a new club.
- 4. Kiwanis Advisor and Faculty Advisor work together to complete the <u>Petition for Charter</u> and mail to Kiwanis International.

Dues & Fees & Responsibilities of the Kiwanis Club:

- \$400 charter fee (typically paid by the Kiwanis Club, if possible).
- Dues:
 - o 2023-2024: \$13.50 annual membership dues/member
 - \$7 for Key Club International + \$6.50 for LaMissTenn District
 - o 2024-2025: \$14 annual membership dues/member
 - \$7 for Key Club International + \$7 for LaMissTenn District
 - All monies are paid to directly Key Club International.
- The Kiwanis Club typically helps with the costs of the charter ceremony (e.g., pizza or some snacks, a cake to celebrate, waters/drinks) and may assist with time and funds for other events throughout the year.
- To the degree possible, a Kiwanis Club should assist students to attend Key Club Rallies, Key Club District Convention, Key Club International Convention, etc.
- The Kiwanis Club assigns a Key Club Kiwanis Advisor who attends meetings (as much as possible) and serves as a liaison between the Kiwanis Club and the Key Club.
