Backpacks for Breaks - Winter Edition

After months of planning and preparation, members of our Kiwanis club gathered to execute our winter installment of *Backpacks for Breaks*, our signature service project designed to address food insecurity in our community.

On Monday, December 14, a group of ten members and special guests met at First Lutheran Church in Ellicott City to fill 150 backpacks with 11 days of meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks). That totals over 4,950 meals! The group made quick work of the project, doing all of the packing in around three hours.

On Friday, December 18, members transported the backpacks to Cradlerock Elementary School for distribution to local children from Cradlerock ES and Lake Elkhorn MS. It was a chilly day, but members persevered through the cold to hand out the bags to families during the special drive-thru event. Thanks to a generous donation from the Coastal Companies, members packed 3,000 pieces of fresh fruit into 150 reusable grocery bags. This provided a healthy addition to our club's offering.

A number of our members participated in some portion of this signature service project and were joined by prospective members, members of the Key Club at Glenelg High School, and two members of the Kiwanis Club of Capital - Next Generation e-Club.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service - January 18th

The Martin Luther King Jr. holiday was the 26th anniversary of the day of service that celebrates the Civil Rights leader's life and legacy. Observed each year on the third Monday in January as "a day on, not a day off," MLK Day is the only federal holiday designated as a national day of service to encourage all Americans to volunteer to improve their communities. In celebration, 15 club members assembled hand warmers that were made out of socks and dry rice, which were donated to the cold weather shelter in Howard County. Each club member requested a handwarmer kit that was dropped off at their house. The hand warmers could be made at their leisure during a two-week period. On January 18th, club members met at the Old Mill Cafe in Ellicott City for coffee, pastries, and to collect all of the assembled warmers.

March 2021

Back by popular demand after the club's holiday party, host Kennette Mitchell lead our members through another competitive trivia match! This time the questions were general and it was anyone's game. It was certainly a nail-biter, as it was a very close game until the last question!

Backpacks for Breaks - Spring Edition

In early April, our club members were joined by members and advisors from the Key Clubs at Glenelg High School and River Hill High School to complete another installment of its signature Backpacks for Breaks service project in collaboration with the Howard County Public School System. Members filled 150 backpacks for students experiencing food insecurity, providing a total of 2,250 meals. In total, 23 members of our Kiwanis family were involved in assembling our backpacks.

Of special note, members of the Key Club at River Hill HS and the student organization *Hawks Fight Hunger* collected over 1,400 individual food items for us to give to families. Thanks to the generosity of Coastal Sunbelt Produce, the club was also able to pack reusable grocery bags with over 2,250 pieces of fresh fruit for our backpack recipients.

This project was made possible by individual donors in Howard County and around the country, as well as a generous grant from the Capital District Kiwanis Foundation. Our club raised over \$1,000 in individual donations in March for this project and over \$3,700 in total this year. Many of these donations were from individuals who are not members of our club.

Scholarships

Howard Community College Endowment



The Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City has been a strong and committed supporter of Howard Community College students. Our club opened an endowment account with Howard Community College in September of 2000 with the goal of providing financial assistance to students in order to ease their ability to obtain a college education. Since that time, through an annual club donation, our endowment account now totals \$73,025 as of September 29, 2021!

Here is a letter that Melissa Mattey, Executive Director of the HCC Educational Foundation shared with our club during her presentation in April 2021:

"I write to you today to express my profound gratitude for the recognition and support you have shown me in my path to educational success. I am filled with gratitude and I am humbled that my work has been recognized and that you have in your free will chosen to help me with my education in the form of a scholarship. I have dreams of going further in my educational career and someday wish to become a pharmacist or a nurse practitioner. This scholarship fund will go a long way to see to it that my dreams become a reality. The scholarship funds have taken away a lot of the burden off my shoulder and have helped make it easier to focus even more on my education, and have enough time to study. I intend to do my possible best to keep up the good work and achieve greater heights. With your noble gesture, the dreams of this young girl from Cameroon will become a reality. Thank you so much. I will not let you down."

Teenager of the Year



The 2021 recipient of the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City's Teenager of the Year Award was Riley Macon, a senior at Reservoir High School. She was on the Principal's Honor Roll every quarter since her freshman year (2017) and earned all A's every quarter. She completed high school with a 4.0 GPA. Riley was well-rounded in her activities and was named a Scholar-Athlete every sports season since freshman year, having maintained a 4.0 GPA every quarter. In 2020, Riley was named an AP Scholar with Distinction after receiving a score of 5 on five AP exams.

Outside of the classroom, Riley was highly engaged in her school and the local community. In September 2019, Riley founded the student group Young Activists and spent many hours each week working with this group. Riley started Young Activists to pursue community service initiatives and promote social justice within her school and the greater Howard County region. Through her work with Young Activists, she held voter registration drives yielding 98 new voters for the 2020 election. She also organized and executed donation drives resulting in 900 items worth over \$2,800.

Starting in June 2019, Riley served as an intern for the Howard County Council. In June 2020, Riley founded Howard County Students for Equity. In addition to all of this, Riley also served as a co-founder and lead member of the group Active Minds. She was also a lead member of the group Youth In Conversation and the creator of a podcast called "Too Many Adults in the Room." Riley was the captain of both the Reservoir HS Varsity Women's Lacrosse Team and the Varsity Women's Field Hockey Team. Riley was also part of the Varsity Track & Field team.

Riley was also named the recipient of the 2021 Capital District Kiwanis Division 4 Teenager of the Year Award.

Howard County Public School System Friends of Education, 2021

The Friends of Education Award was established in 2001 to salute exemplary volunteer contributions of time and talent that directly support academic achievement and safe learning environments for the HCPSS. The Howard County Board of Education recognized the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City with its prestigious Friends of Education Award during its Board meeting on Thursday, April 15, 2021. As part of our recognition, the following was shared about our

club: "The Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City has been passionate in its support for Howard County students since the club was chartered in 1940. Members of the club provide extensive support for students through multiple commitments, including sponsorship of Key Clubs at Atholton, Centennial, Glenelg, Marriotts Ridge, Mt. Hebron and River Hill high schools, through which hundreds of student participants contribute many hours of service to the community each year. Additionally, the Kiwanis Club sponsors the Backpacks for Break service initiative with Cradlerock Elementary School and Lake Elkhorn Middle School, as well as a Terrific Kids recognition program at Bryant Woods **Elementary School.**"





Walter Zeller Fellowship

During the annual business meeting on May 3, 2021, the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City awarded its final Walter Zeller Fellowship to Past President Len Hart.

Len is the club's charter representative to Cub Scout Pack 838, which our club sponsors. Len is also a past chair of the Service Project and Partnerships Committee, as well as a past chair of the Nominating Committee. He is currently chair of the Financial Review Committee. Len is a Past President of the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City, during which time he led our engagement with new community charities and strengthened our administrative processes which have improved our readiness for the more demanding financial environment we are in. Further, Len serves as the project chair for our Adopt-a-Road program.

The Eliminate Project, a partnership between the Kiwanis family and UNICEF, has achieved near total worldwide eradication of maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT). The Walter Zeller Fellowship is one of the means employed by the Kiwanis Children's Fund to ensure the success of The Eliminate Project. According to Kiwanis International, each Walter Zeller Fellowship, which costs \$1250, saves or protects more than 690 women and their future babies.

Since 2011, the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City has purchased one Zeller Fellowship each year in recognition of a single member's sustained contributions. Selection is made by the club's existing Zeller Fellowship and Hixson Award recipients.


Capital District Distinguished Club

Kiwanis Children's Fund Silver Club

Kiwanis International has been fighting maternal and neonatal tetanus since 2010 when the organization partnered with UNICEF through The Eliminate Project. During that campaign, which officially concluded on December 31, 2020, Kiwanis worldwide raised money for lifesaving vaccines, health education, and safe birth environments, to allow millions of women to give birth without fear of their babies dying from this horrible disease. Through fundraising efforts over the last ten years, maternal and neonatal tetanus has been eliminated from 27 countries with the help of Kiwanis International.

Annually, Kiwanis clubs are recognized for their contributions to The Eliminate Project. The Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City is very pleased to have received silver level recognition for this past year, which indicates we fundraised and contributed at least \$25 per member to the effort!



Legion of Honor
