






Veteran's Day Parade - November 7th

On Tuesday, December 21, club members, fellow Kiwanis members, and guests gathered to fill 150 backpacks with 11 days of meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks). That totals over 4,950 meals! The group made quick work of the project, doing all of the packing in around three hours. Thanks to a generous donation from the Coastal Companies, members packed 3,000 pieces of fresh fruit into 150 reusable grocery bags. This provided a healthy addition to our club's offering.

Club members then transported the backpacks to Cradlerock Elementary School for distribution to local children from Cradlerock ES and Lake Elkhorn MS.

Backpacks for Breaks - Spring Edition

In early April, the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City met to fill 150 backpacks with 10 days worth of food as part of its Backpacks for Breaks partnership with the Howard County Public School System. The volunteer team included 14 members of the Kiwanis club and 13 guests, including members of Cub Scout Pack 838, the Kiwanis Club of Capital District - Next Generation e-Club, the Key Club at Glenelg HS, the Key Club at Marriotts Ridge HS, the Key Club at River Hill HS, and the Hawks Fight Hunger Club at River Hill HS.

In total, over 4,950 meals and snacks were provided to alleviate the food insecurity many students and families face during school breaks when free and reduced-cost meals are not readily accessible. Thank you to Coastal Sunbelt for their generous donation of 2,000 pieces of fresh fruit to the project, allowing each student to receive both a backpack stocked with food, as well as a reusable shopping bag filled with healthy snacks. Thank you, also, to the many members of the community who made generous donations to help fund this program. This initiative would not be possible without you. We are proud of this hands-on service project that engages our community and the entire Kiwanis family, and we hope to continue it for many years to come!

Teenager of the Year



The 2022 recipient of the Kiwanis Club of Ellicott City's Teenager of the Year Award was Avala (Ava) Stamatakis, a junior at Glenelg High School. In her personal statement, Ava shared the following:

"My experiences serving others have constituted an extraordinary journey and have taught me invaluable lessons. First: service is for everyone. Regardless of one's race, gender, ethnicity, age, socioeconomic status, etc., they can always contribute to the world. Second: service is a source of joy for both the server and the served. The served experiences joy from having their needs met, and this joy radiates from the served into the server. Lastly: the best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in serving others. Through volunteering, I have been able to discover my true passions, uncover my beliefs, and learn more about myself than ever before."

One of her recommendation letters stated the following:

"Ava has made a difference in her community by encouraging everyone to get involved and to serve. Her lead by example efforts have put her at the top of the service hours earned log. She is always looking for opportunities for others to get involved and then encouraging them to join her as she volunteers right beside them. Her friendly smile and inclusive attitude let everyone know that she wants them to enjoy serving others as much as she does."

Ava was also named the recipient of the 2022 Capital District Kiwanis Division 4 Teenager of the Year Award.
