The Centennial Internet Kiwanis Club was conceived by the class of 2014-2015 of Governors-Elect during their training session in November of 2013 in Indianapolis.





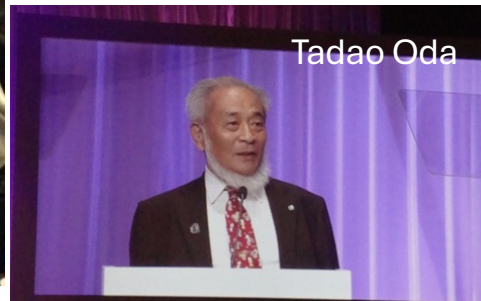

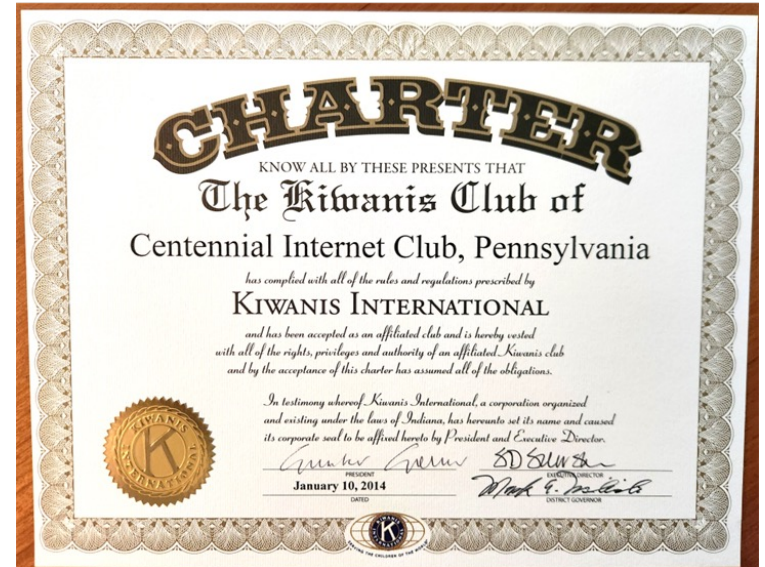

The Centennial eKiwanis Club was conceived by a few 2013-14 Governors-Elect in Indianapolis, Indiana during their November 2013 training session. In January 2014, at the SLP Conference in Indianapolis, the club was formed. Charter ceremonies took place at the Kiwanis International Convention in Chiba, Japan on July 16, 2014. We are chartered in the Pennsylvania District.

Officers for 2013-14 and 2014-15 are President Bob Raub (Pennsylvania District) and Secretary/Treasurer Brian Bell (Capital District). Directors are Jim Smith (Indiana District), Diana Keplinger (Ohio District) and Hilde Meyer (Norden District). The club has the following committees and chairs: Technology Committee (Sepp Schachermayr, Austria District), Membership Committee (Serge Viau, Eastern Canada and the Caribbean District), Service Committee (Peter Zander, Australia District), Fundraising Committee (Gary Cooper, Carolinas District), and SLP Committee (Stephen Plank, Rocky Mountain District).

Although most of the charter members are 2014-15 District Governors, membership is open to any individuals -- around the world.

This Centennial eKiwanis Club can be a learning experience for those wishing to understand how an internet club works, with the opportunity to then branch off and charter a new Internet or local Kiwanis Club. Service and fundraising projects may be conducted on a global and/or local scale.

Club and Board eMeetings are held using www.anymeeting.com. Members receive an email invitation to join the meeting. They register to attend the meeting and receive an e-mail with a link to join the meeting -- either on their computer (preferred) or by phone. Video cams are used sparingly to preserve bandwidth. A head set with a mic is recommended for audio. However, attendees are requested to mute their mics when not speaking. A chat line is available for all attendees to use and see.
