Yes, showing off your achievements can do so, but it's important to write using a tone and structure that best represents you, not who you think an admissions counselor is looking for.

2. When talking about activities, use numbers! If you are talking about your status as a Key Club member, maybe include how many service hours you've earned or the amount of money you've raised.

3. Use the mundane to separate yourself from others. Sometimes, when it comes to writing an essay, you have no major watershed moment in your life to talk about; no big issues, no big progress. At least, that's what you think. Instead of writing generally about one large event, pinpoint on a very specific circumstance and its impact on you.

I hope my tips can provide you with some help, and I wish all seniors the best of luck on the application process!

Box 6069, Dept. 123, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46206. Remember, the Dues for Louisiana-Mississippi-W. Tennessee are \$13.50: \$7.00 for Key Club International and \$6.50 for the District itself. All dues are sent to Kiwanis Youth Programs or Key Club International and they will reimburse the District their portion of the dues. You do not have to send two checks. Thank you all so much for your dedication, responsibility, and **timeliness**!








## **Key Club Week**
