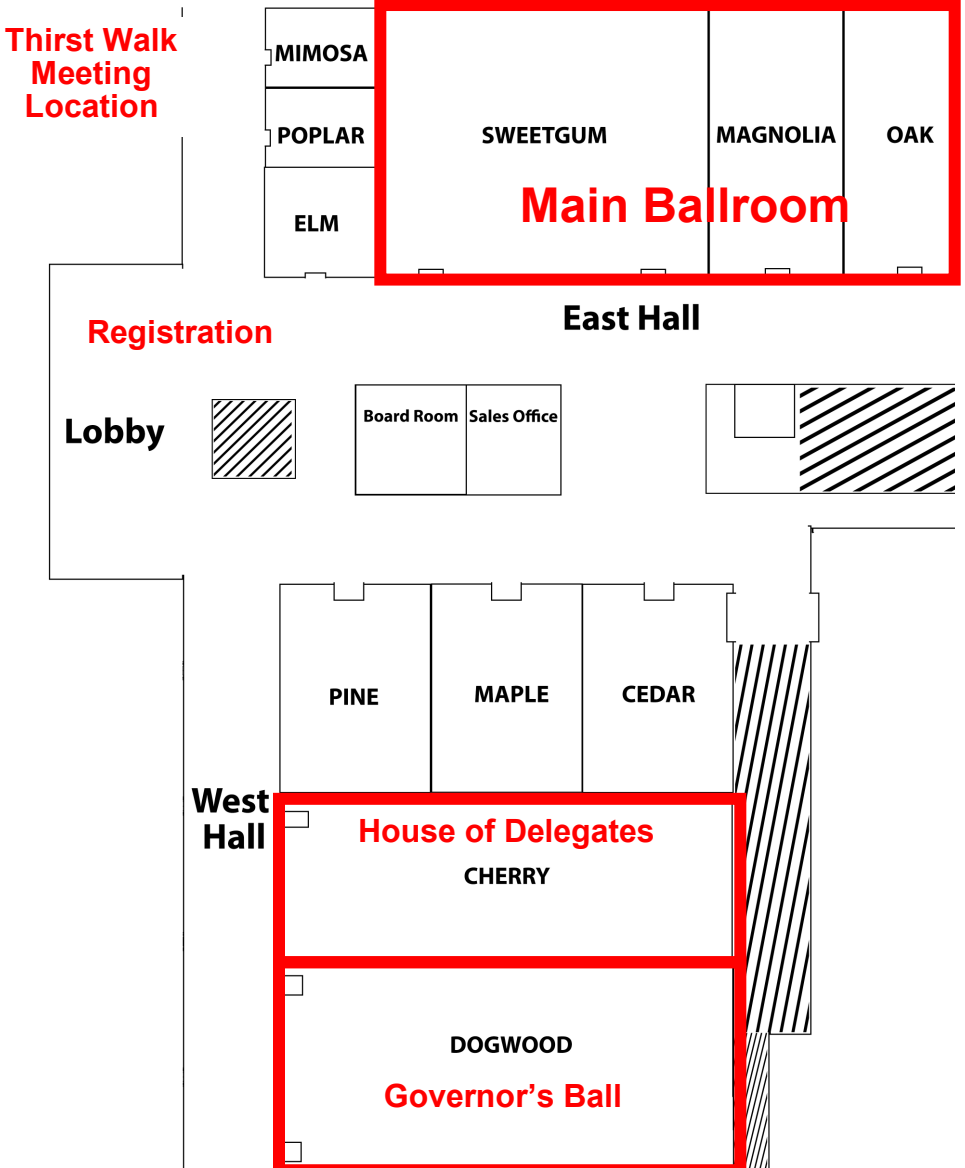

CODE OF CONDUCT

GENERAL STATEMENT

Your Key Club District Board, the Sergeant-At-Arms Committee, and our Adult Advisors and Kiwanians urge everyone to enjoy the convention fully. To ensure proper behavior, the Board has adopted the following rules, "The Convention Code of Conduct," to assure the safety, comfort, and pleasure of everyone.

1. All convention attendees must be properly registered for the convention. All registrants and participants must wear their name badge in the appropriate manner, and wear their convention wristband at all times when they are outside of their hotel room.
2. All Key Clubbers and Advisors are **REQUIRED** to attend all convention general sessions and caucuses, as published in the official convention program.
3. No Key Clubber or Advisor will be permitted to leave the hotel property on Friday evening or Saturday evening beginning with the evening convention sessions and/or banquet, and ending the following mornings at 6:00 a.m. (without specific permission from the District Administrator.)

RESPONSIBLE BEHAVIOR

1. All Key Clubbers are expected to conduct themselves as responsible young adults, and are expected to attend all sessions and activities.
2. All participants are expected to abide by all government laws and regulations.
3. **NO** female Key Clubbers or guests are to be permitted in male Key Clubber's or guest's room. **NO** male Key Clubbers or guests are to be permitted in the room of any female Key Clubber or any other female guest.
4. Each Key Clubber will be responsible for all hotel property in his/her room and will be charged for any damages in that room. This applies to **ALL** convention participants. Everyone is advised to check the hotel room before occupying it. If any damage is evident prior to occupancy, Key Clubbers and Advisors are required to report the damages to the hotel desk and District Administrator **IMMEDIATELY!**
5. **INTOXICANTS OF ANY NATURE** (including beer, wine, drugs, etc.), **SMOKING, OR VAPING** will **NOT** be permitted in the possession of **ANYONE** at the convention.
6. Members are expected to abstain from any activity of a sexual nature.
7. Members may not possess weapons, firecrackers or anything of a dangerous nature.
8. Unnecessary noises are prohibited. "Unnecessary noises" are defined as, but not limited to such things as yelling in the hallways, excessive loud talking in the sleeping rooms, playing the TV/radio/or sound system on a high volume.

CODE OF CONDUCT

LODGING

1. For security and liability reasons, everyone registering for the District Convention must stay in the official Convention Hotels.
2. A curfew of 12:00 am will be observed on Friday and 11:00pm on Saturday nights. Curfew ends at 6:00 AM.
3. Items within this section may be modified by the District Administrator.

DRESS CODE

1. All participants are expected to abide by the designated dress code for each session.
2. **Friday, Opening Session:** If running for office, business professional; if not, business casual.
3. **Friday, Caucusing:** If running for office, business professional; if not, business casual.
4. **Saturday morning:** convention shirt, jeans (no shorts or ripped jeans), tennis shoes
5. **Saturday afternoon/House of Delegates:** If running for office, business professional; if not, business casual.
6. **Saturday, Banquet & Governor's Ball:** business professional/party dress
7. **Sunday, Governor's Farewell Brunch:** business professional
8. Clothing which may cause distractions during the convention, in brief, dress apparel unbecoming of a Key Clubber will not be allowed.
9. All participants are required to wear name badges at all times when they are outside of their hotel room.

ENFORCEMENT

The District Board and/or District Administrator reserves the right to remove any person from the convention with a letter to his/her parents, school administration, and sponsoring Kiwanis Club for infractions of ANY of the above regulations, AND for conduct unbecoming of a Key Clubber.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Names Badges: Everyone registered for the Convention was issued a name badge, which must be worn in plain sight at all times during the convention. Individuals not wearing their name badges will not be allowed admission into the Convention sessions.

Each Key Club is allowed 2 voting delegates. All such delegates should check in with the Credentials Desk during the normal registration period on Friday afternoon.

Convention Dress Code: The LaMissTenn District Board has established the official Dress Code for this convention to be "Professional Business Attire." Refer to the Convention Code of Conduct (page 12-13) for details. To further define this Dress Code, the dress for the convention should be similar to that worn on a professional business interview. Clothing which may cause distractions during the convention, in brief, dress unbecoming a Key Clubber, will not be allowed. For the Workshops, Key Clubbers are encouraged to wear their convention t-shirt with jeans or slacks (shorts, ripped jeans, and sweatpants are not allowed).

Convention Curfew is set for 12:00am on Friday and 11:00pm on Saturday nights. Everyone is expected to be in his or her own room. Curfew ends at 6:00 am. NO ONE is allowed to leave the hotel during convention sessions, or after curfew. VIOLATORS WILL BE SENT HOME!

Sergeant-At-Arms: Every adult attending the convention will serve on the Sergeant-At-Arms Committee.

A **Meeting of ALL Candidates** for District Office AND their Advisors will be held at 6:30pm on Friday in the Nashville Room. This is a required orientation meeting for all District position applicants and candidates AND their Faculty Advisors. Business professional.

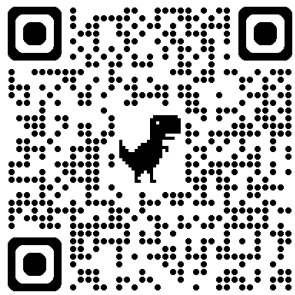
