Establishing a new club in a community brings numerous benefits. It fosters a sense of unity and belonging among members, providing a platform for individuals to connect, share interests, and support each other. Service clubs also play a crucial role in community development by promoting civic engagement and volunteerism, addressing local needs and challenges through collective action. Overall, the formation of a new club can significantly enhance the social and economic vitality of a community.

Our district is embarking on a significant project that involves the establishment of several new clubs. This initiative requires meticulous planning, building, and nurturing, especially through the critical first three years. We are seeking dedicated members who are eager to contribute their time and skills to make this a success.

We are currently focusing on developing new clubs in three communities within our District, Division 1 Williston ND, Division 2 West Fargo ND and Division 6 Faribault Mn. While travel is optional, there is a designated budget available for on-site club building activities. Your involvement could significantly impact our progress and help us achieve our goals. Exploring ways to contribute from home can be just as

impactful as traveling to the community.

One effective method is to assist in organizing and creating a list of potential names and contact information in a community. Community and Chamber websites are good sources for these contacts. This list can then be used by others who will call them to set appointments to explain Kiwanis and why we are building a club in their community.

These tasks aid in streamlining the process by creating appointments already scheduled for those who will do the on-site work. Following these steps and providing ongoing support also helps to ensure that Kiwanis reverses the number of new clubs closing in the first 3 years.

All that's required is a bit of your time and a computer with WiFi. If you're interested, just let us know, and we'll arrange a training session at a time that works best for you. This is a great opportunity to volunteer and enhance your skills from the comfort of your own space.

As we get ready to wrap up our Kiwanis December activities and say goodbye to the 2024 calendar year, here's wishing all of you a splendid, peaceful, healthy, and safe holidays, with time to spend with those you love and care about.

The District Giving report is available through 11/30/24, showing the Total Giving from MNDAK in 23-24 is \$54,488.00. I received an email informing us that our district is eligible for a Grant Rebate of \$2,724.00. The check will be mailed directly to MNDAK Educational Foundation, Attn: Lowell Disrud.

Thank you, thank you for clubs getting an early start with the contributions. I hope you all realize how grateful the Children's Fund Board and Trustees are for your support.

Along with the District Giving for 23-24 information, the report also shows a total of \$9,499 has been sent to the Children's Fund for October and November. This includes both Club and Individual giving.

All funds sent to the Children's Fund are counted towards the *Possibility Project*. The

<u>Project</u> has collected over \$6,000,000.00 already, with our District contributing a total of \$124,856.00 as of November 2024.

The Project goal is \$25,000,000.00 to serve 10 million children. That is \$2.25 per child. Are we all ready to make a commitment to continue participating in the Possibility Project for the next 4 to 5 years? I will forward the Commitment form to all clubs and Lt Governors to share with others and discuss clubs' plans to participate. Granite Falls Popcorn Stand Completes 106th Year



The Granite Falls Kiwanis Popcorn Stand has now completed its 106th continuous year of operations. The Popcorn Stand was started in 1919 by local business owners and brothers Fred and Julius Ernston, and was owned by the same family for the first 62 years.

Subsequently, the Popcorn Stand was bought and sold several times until 2002 when the business was donated to the Granite Falls Kiwanis by then owners, and Kiwanis members, David Kafka and Jill Prahm. For the past 24 seasons, the Popcorn Stand has been owned by Granite Falls Kiwanis and operated by its Kiwanis volunteer members.

The Popcorn Stand is open seasonally, every evening from May 1 to Labor Day and weekends in September, 7:00 to 9:30 pm. Not only is the Popcorn Stand the major fundraiser for Granite Falls Kiwanis, but the business also provides a community service as a destination and summer activity for many families throughout Southwest Minnesota, and beyond.

In 2024 this fundraising activity generated \$39,200 net revenue all of which was donated back to the community youth and

related youth organizations. Also, in 2024, through community businesses and individual donations, a new Popcorn Stand facility was built, doubling the size of the building and adding extra amenities.

The Granite Falls Popcorn Stand and Kiwanis are known synonymously for providing a great service to the community.
